Cedar Bayou is open

Cedar Bayou and Vinson Slough flow freely to the Gulf once again

September 25 marked the day that fishermen across the state of Texas have been waiting for, for a long time. With approximately 100 local residents, dignitaries and CCA Texas volunteers on hand, Aransas County Judge Burt Mills took to the controls of the excavator and dug the final scoop of sand that allowed Cedar Bayou to flow into the Gulf of Mexico once again.

"The middle Texas coast, and more specifically the Mesquite Bay complex, just underwent a successful "double bypass" following the historic re-opening of Cedar Bayou and Vinson Slough," commented CCA Texas Chairman Mark Ray. Mark commented further, "with dedication and closely coordinated effort between CCA Texas,

Aransas County, state agencies and the Texas legislature, the essential arteries for water exchange and the highway for larval and adult fish migration are again flowing. This iconic natural resource of Texas coastal waters has been re-gifted to the fishing and naturalist public of Texas."

"CCA Texas was a great partner in our quest for getting Cedar Bayou opened," said Aransas County Judge Burt Mills. "All of our partners have done an outstanding job in working together to ensure the restoration of this pass."

Due to the Ixtoc Oil spill in the Bay of Campeche in 1979, state agencies made the decision to bulldoze the pass shut to prevent any oil from entering the ecosystems fed by Cedar Bayou and Vinson Slough. Prior to its closure in 1979, Cedar Bayou was open approximately 87% of the time. There were temporary and short term closures dating back to the early 1900s and dredging events in 1939 and 1959 but in general, Mother Nature kept the bayou open. After the 1979 closure, Cedar Bayou was never the same. With the exception of dredging events in 1987 and 1995, the bayou remained open for

short periods of time. In 2003, Hurricane Claudette opened the bayou one last time, but only for a brief period.

> he effort to open Cedar Bayou has been a long and dedicated effort by many since it was closed in 1979. Save Cedar Bayou, Inc. (SCBI) was formed in 1985 and struggled to make head way. In 2003, the Aransas County Cedar Bayou Advisory Committee was formed to take a look at the challenges and obstacles in restoring Cedar Bayou. The committee's report energized the community once again and SCBI renewed its efforts to see that the bayou was opened.

> Between 2006 and 2008, SCBI and the Texas General Land Office (TX GLO) spent \$400,000 in efforts to study and create a plan for opening and maintaining Cedar Bayou. After continuous efforts to secure the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) permit and to raise necessary funds the efforts began to stall and SCBI approached Aransas County to take over the permit process. In December of 2009, Aransas County accepted the request and the effort began to move forward once again under the leadership of County Judge Burt Mills. Aransas County worked hard to satisfy the permitting process of the USACE and moved through the process efficiently. On August 3, 2011, Judge Mills received and signed the



USACE permit to move forward with the restoration of Cedar Bayou and Vinson Slough.

CA Texas leadership maintained an interest in the restoration of Cedar Bayou as the permitting process proceeded and offered written support when needed. Once the USACE permit was secured by Aransas County, CCA Texas met with Aransas County leadership shortly afterward and offered to help in the effort to raise the necessary funds to make the project a reality.

In February 2012, the CCA Texas State Board approved an initial commitment of \$500,000 to jumpstart the fundraising process and the partnership began to accelerate its efforts. CCA Texas eventually committed \$1,600,000 to the project through dollars raised by local chapters, secured from private donations and CCA National's Building Conservation Trust. Texas Parks and Wildlife

committed \$3,000,000, TX GLO approximately \$1,400,000 and the balance of the \$9,400,000 project was secured and guaranteed by Aransas County.

With the money in hand and another window of opportunity for construction nearing in 2014, the Notice to Bid was issued by Aransas County and in December 2013, RLB Contracting was awarded the bid to restore Cedar Bayou and Vinson





Slough. With a tight schedule and little room for error, RLB began its planning process and preparing for April 15, 2014 to start one of the most significant restoration efforts ever on the Texas coast in the eyes of many.

The surveying process started and with confirmation

that whooping cranes were gone, RLB began moving equipment in on April 15. There were many challenges ahead for the workers and by mid May, actual dredging and excavation had begun. The first task at hand was removal of the old dredge spoil sitting on Vinson Slough. As this was being completed, dredging in Cedar Bayou was underway and the excavators began the process of excavating materials within the template of Vinson Slough.

On May 21, 2014, CCA Texas leadership and members of Aransas County Commissioners Court made a group site visit and the project was moving full steam ahead. Construction continued

Cedar Bayou maintenance fund receives \$1M grant, thanks to the Sid W. **Richardson Foundation**

The Sid W. Richardson Foundation has made a \$1 million grant to the Texas Parks and Wildlife Foundation for the maintenance of Cedar Bayou in Aransas County, Texas. Mr. Pete Geren, the Richardson Foundation's president and chief executive officer, presented a ceremonial check on Monday, Oct. 13, 2014, for \$1 million, made payable to the Texas Parks and Wildlife Foundation, to Aransas County Judge C.H. "Burt" Mills, Jr. and Jay Kleberg, associate director of the Texas Parks and Wildlife Foundation, during the Aransas County Commissioners' meeting in Rockport, Texas.

Through the efforts of a public-private partnership led by the Aransas County judge and county commissioners, Cedar Bayou was reopened to the Gulf of Mexico on September 25, 2014, reconnecting Aransas and Mesquite Bays and Vinson Slough to the gulf. The flows through Cedar Bayou will improve the



quality of the bay system and enhance the habitat for bird and marine life, and the quality of life for residents and visitors.

The Texas Parks and Wildlife Foundation will allocate the funds to Aransas County, which will oversee the maintenance of Cedar Bayou. Geren also recognized Coastal Conservation Association Texas, Save Cedar Bayou, Inc. and numerous private donors that joined with the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department, the Texas General Land Office and Aransas County in providing the funds necessary to com-

plete this historic \$9.4 million conservation initiative.

INGREDIENTS: ¹/₂ cup butter / 1 cup chopped onion / 1 cup chopped celery / ¹/₂ cup chopped Tasso ham or chopped bacon

2 shallots minced / ½ t black pepper ½ t nutmeg / 2 t Old Bay Seasoning

¹/₄ cup flour / 2 cups milk / 1 cup heavy cream 1 cup chicken stock / 1 cup oyster liquor / 1-2 T Worcestershire 1 qt oysters / 2 cans artichoke bottoms chopped ¹/₄ cup dry sherry optional

PREPARATION:

Melt butter in large stock pot; add tasso/bacon and cook through. Over medium heat add onion, celery, shallots and sauté until tender 8-10 minutes. Add Old Bay, nutmeg, pepper. Whisk in flour and stir constantly until all ingredients are combined for 3-4 minutes. Gradually add chicken broth and oyster liquor, mixing well. Add Worcester-



shire and artichokes and simmer a few minutes. Turn down heat: add milk and cream and continue stirring being careful not to scorch. Add ovsters and sherry; simmer a few more minutes until oysters have slightly curled and are heated though. Garnish with fresh chopped parsley. 🧨

through the summer and the weather seemed to cooperate with the exception of a few weeks of high winds.

The construction equipment took a beating, but RLB and their support crews stayed on top of things to ensure the timeline remained intact. By mid August the connection between Cedar Bayou and Vinson Slough was made and the final dredging and excavation in Vinson continued. At this point, excavation for the final stretch of Cedar Bayou began. The end was near and the anticipation of completion began to grow for not only the residents of Aransas County and CCA Texas members but for the entire Texas fishing community.

"The opening of Cedar Bayou is a project that I have been working on for the past 8 years. It has historically been an ephemeral channel, which means it has been intermittently open and closed depending on the weather conditions. Since sand was placed in Vinson Slough, the channel was unable to re-open during optimal weather conditions. This also caused a continual accumulation of windblown sand within the inlet's natural path," commented Coast & Harbor Project Engineer Matt Campbell. Campbell continued, "We realized early on in our analysis how important it was to re-establish the connection with Vinson Slough, because it would help provide sufficient flushing within the inlet that is needed to maintain the hydraulic connection between the Gulf of Mexico and Mesquite Bay."

In the final month and a half of the project, the Cedar Bayou and Vinson Slough area began to come alive once again with baitfish, shore birds and predator fish. Each trip to the job site was met with stories of increased fish and game activity in the area and the feeling that the end was near. September 25, 2014 is a day that will be etched in the memory of many as the day that Mesquite, Aransas and surrounding bays and the area marsh came to life once again.

"Cedar Bayou is one of those great projects that have benefits on so many levels. Not only will it help the ecosystem in the surrounding bays, but will strengthen our fisheries, waterfowl and whooping cranes, while providing a world class fishing destination for all Texas anglers to enjoy," CCA Texas Executive Director Robby Byers commented. Byers continued. "This is truly a fantastic project for the Texas coast and CCA Texas looks forward to seeing the benefits it presents to the area ecosystem as well as the local communities and fishermen."

edar Bayou and Vinson Slough have been open for over a month as this Currents is mailed, and the results of the opening have been amazing. The path of the two water ways seems to change daily and a strong flow of water continues to be present both incoming and outgoing as the tides and weather dictate. The Center for Sportfish Science and Conservation at Harte Research Institute started their formal post construction surveys in late October and the staff is finding an abundance of redfish larvae in the monitoring areas within Cedar Bayou and the surrounding areas. The prior two years of monitoring found no larvae in these areas before the opening. This finding alone is monumental and speaks volumes to the value of this natural pass when open and functioning. Cedar Bayou/Vinson Slough and the surrounding bays are alive once again. 🏹

Evidence of New Life Found Shortly After

Opening of Historic Pass Researchers and students with the Center for Sportfish Science and Conservation were out only a few days after Cedar Bayou had been opened to do some preliminary sampling assessments. They were pleasantly surprised to already find a high abundance of very young and newly recruited red drum to the area.

While the post-studies are just in the beginning phase, this is certainly a very positive sign of the impact the Bayou will have. In stark contrast, the pre-studies in this immediate area over the prior two year period showed an absence of these fish when the inlet was closed even after intensive sampling. Now, only days after opening, it appears that the young larvae and early juveniles of spawning redfish and small fish about the size of a pinky nail in the Gulf have already found their way through the inlet to access the lush nursery habitats in the region.

This is a remarkable finding, given that we are just beginning to enter the spawning phase for red drum. Things should only get better as the peak of spawning season begins.

Report from TP&W Game Wardens Caught Redhanded!

On April 1, 2011, Galveston County Game Warden Bobby Kana received an Operation Game Thief (OGT) call advising him that three individuals at the South Jetties in Galveston were in possession of 30 bull red fish. Warden Kana notified Wardens Vu Nguyen and Mack Chambers of the violations and requested their assistance in locating the violators.

While in route to the South Jetty, Warden Kana made contact with the complainant who advised him that the three individuals had loaded into a grey pickup truck and were leaving the area. Warden Nguyen contacted the Galveston PD and advised them of the vio-

lations and vehicle description. Within minutes, Galveston PD responded that they had the vehicle stopped. Wardens Kana, Nguyen and Chambers arrived at the location and found a pile of red drum in the back of the vehicle. The three individuals were transported to the local JP where a total of \$13,500 in fines was assessed. The violators were in possession of 29 red fish, of which 28 were bull reds, one black drum and one Jack crevalle.

During Memorial Day Weekend, 2014, a

vessel was contacted to do a water safety inspection. When finished with the inspection, Game Wardens asked the occupants if they had been fishing and they responded, "No." The Game Wardens inspected the coolers on the boat and noticed a few slot red drums were visible.

Upon further investigation of the cooler, a plastic bag full of slot red drum was pulled out, totaling 23 red drum.

The Wardens then escorted the vessel to their dock for further investigation.

While investigating the vessel, 10 more red drum were discovered in a hidden compartment under the deck.

The four individuals on board the vessel were in possession of 33 red drum, ranging in size from 19.5 in to 27 in. Citations were issued totaling \$2,400 dollars in fines and \$7,707 dollars in civil restitution.

Upper Coast By Capt. Ralph Frazier

A cold winter? Adjust.

All the predictions for the end of 2014 and the beginning of 2015 are that it's going to be an extremely cold winter. If that's true, we are going to have to start thinking more about deep water channel fishing which is not done very often in our area.

Learning how to fish drop-offs can be extremely challenging but also very rewarding. Lucky for us, the invention of all the new electronics should make it easier to zero in on the depth the fish are at. Side scan and remote control troll motors with GPS technology are taking a lot of the guesswork out of fishing. Still, the most critical part of deep water fishing is finding the exact depth. As all the bass guys know, suspended fish are the hardest to catch.

Always count your line down and make sure you pay close attention to exactly what you were doing when you got the strike as presentation is always the most important part of filling the ice chest. If you are not lucky enough to have all the high tech stuff, turn your depth finder so that you can see it while running your troll motor to stay on the drop-offs. Making sure to have proper clothing "layered" can sometimes be the key to catching more fish, as it's a lot easier to concentrate when you're not freezing. Good Fishing—**Capt. Middle Coast By Capt. Jay Watkins

Gamefish respond to frontal passages The winter months have long been my favorite times of the year to fish. Lower tides and cold water temperatures concentrate both trout and redfish along the Middle Texas Coast. We have a ton of shoreline drop-offs with deeper submerged grass beds, scattered areas of oyster shell. Locating the proper structure along with a food source is never more important than in the winter months when food can be scarce. Rockport area bay systems provide some really nice wind breaks during high wind situations, definitely an added attraction.

Recent rains and the opening of the Cedar Bayou and Vincent Slough area promises to improve salinity levels as well as add much needed tidal circulations, particularly in the Mesquite bay and Spaulding areas.

A special thanks to the CCA's John Blaha and Aransas County's Burt Mills for working to see that the pass was reopened.

Resident trout and redfish alike will be responding to frontal passages by moving up to the mouths of the drains and areas of grass or shell and waiting for falling water to pull bait fish to them. Patience, and paying close attention to your Solunar tables will increase your odds of scoring big. Bass Assassins in the 5" Shad and Die Dapper patterns and Corky's are my go-to lures. À 1/16th ounce jig head 99% of the time, preferring the slowest fall time that I can get during the winter months. I have found that Corky's with clear silver or gold sides and lighter colored backs work very well. www.customcorky.com provides some really great color patterns. Colder? Slower, deeper, bird action

In December, the extreme high tides that scattered fish and shrimp will be back to normal, so for a quick fix on gamefish location we'll be watching bird action. And, we'll be back to occasional winds. That can be good, since it brings the gamefish up under the birds, and may mean fewer human competitors.

Colder water, so slow down that retrieve, and start deeper. On those warm stretches of December, wadefishers will work shallower areas, but slowwwwly. When the fronts move in as the month moves on, look for the deeper areas on your chart. Consider working the Land Cut area, which can be a lot of fun and productive to boot, with sight casting a possibility in clearer water. Incidentally, the large number of black drum in that area seem to be back to health.

Be careful around the rocks in Baffin, but try the old Alameda Rattler, with live bait or Gulp! In fact, Gulp! is like that credit card ad: I never leave port without it. I like light baits, 1/8 oz, up to 3/8 depending on conditions. And, slowwww.

Of course, January fishing can be similar, but even colder and windier. Remember that conditions change fast, so know before you go and go prepared. It's important to leave plenty of room for your fellow fishers—this resource is all ours.
