

Save Callinectes sapidus! And other marine life. Abandoned Crab Trap Removal Program coming up Feb. 21 - March 2

Leave it better than you found it It's an old CCA tradition

Abandoned Crab Traps, Big Shell Beach and East Cut Cleanup are on CCA agendas

e exceeded the 30,000 trap mark last year. Woo hoo! Today, the total number of traps removed stands at 30,449 since the program began in 2002. The most removed from any gulf state!

Only 897 traps were removed from primary Galveston and San Antonio Bays in 2013, but that is good. When the program began in 2002, we removed nearly 10

times that amount, which shows how well the program has worked since its inception. We now can look out across the bay, shoot the flats, wade the shallows and not have to worry about encountering a derelict trap, thanks to the hundreds of volunteers that unselfishly gave a half day of their time and energy to protect our invaluable nature resources, so that all bay users can benefit.

Removal of the traps not only removes unsightly marine debris, but saves countless marine organisms from the "ghost fishing" effects of these derelict traps. Providing sustenance to a variety of marine organisms throughout their lifespan, blue crabs benefit the most from the removal program. For each year a derelict trap

ghost fishes, six legal sized blue crabs succumb to the ghost fishing effects of these traps annually and if the 30,000 + traps removed killed six crabs/year and with 63% of the traps were in a fishing condition and each trap kills 26 crabs per year then nearly 500,000 blue crabs were saved.

And, that estimate is only for one of the 40 species that has been documented trapped in these derelict traps. Included in savings are most game fish species and species of special concern, like diamondback terrapins.

Many partners are required to make this program a success. From the local host sites, to organizations such as CCA, Coastal Bend Bays & Estuaries Program, Galveston Bay Foundation, USFWS, local municipalities, cities, counties and numerous others each contributing significantly to the success of this program, now in its 13th year.

This year's closure will occur February 21st to March 2nd. The main

Only 897 traps were removed from primary Galveston and San Antonio Bays in 2013, but that is good news. event day will be Saturday , February 22, from 8:00 to noon or so. While all sites will stand alone for the duration, some of the more popular sites

will be facilitated by TPŴD staff or partners on that Saturday.

CCA is providing gloves for every volunteer and plenty of fresh water. Tarps will be available to those who wish to participate. Shallow draft boats, air boats and personnel will be needed to removed traps directly from the bay, while on shore there will be a need for volunteers to help unload vessels.

This year's Abandoned Crab Trap Closure will begin on February 21 and run 10 days, through March 2.

Our main event day will be on Saturday the 16th. CCA Texas and the Texas Parks & Wildlife Department (TPWD) are looking for vol-

unteers to help with fishing surveys for the East Galveston Bay Reef Restoration project. It's critical to have data before and after. You can be that important Fishing Scientist. The \$3.7 million project will restore approximately 140 acres of oyster reef in the East Galveston Bay system. Areas targeted for restoration include one location on Hannah's Reef, two locations on Pepper Grove and two locations on Middle Reef.

This effort is an important part of the project. As a Fishing Scientist, your efforts will be critical in understanding the benefits of oyster reef restoration all along the Texas coast.

The fishing periods will be seasonal times during the months of June to August, then September to November, December to February and March to May.

Pre-construction efforts through the end of 2013, and post-construction efforts will take place beginning June 2014 through 2015.

Great Foods / Food Editor Ellen Ohmstede **OYSTERS ROCKEFELLER**

Celebrate this 2014 with oysters! They are great right now.

This is an adaptation of a recipe from the Jr. League of Baton Rouge River Roads Recipes. If you don't have oyster shells you can use ramekins.

4 dozen oysters

4 packs of frozen spinach (cook in microwave and drained) I bunch green onion 2 stalks celery / 1 bunch parsley 2-3 t anise seed (slightly crushed) 3 T Worcestershire sauce 3-4 sticks butter melted 2-3 T anchovy paste 1 t salt / 1 t pepper Dash of Tabasco/ 1 1/2 cups breadcrumbs/ 1 box Rock salt

Preheat oven to 450. For the sauce: Blend all greens in the food processor using butter as a liquefier. Add all seasonings and 3/4 cups breadcrumbs (Saving the rest for topping). Puree to smooth thick paste. Season to taste. Set aside. For the oysters: Drain oysters from their liquid. Spread on a cookie sheet and bake in oven for 5-10 minutes or until the edges curl. The goal is to preheat the oysters and re-

move even more liquid.

Assembly: using rock salt, make a sturdy base on another cookie sheet. Place either oyster shells or ramekins on rock salt. Fill shells or ramekins with preheated oysters. Then cover with a generous helping of room temperature spinach mixture. Place in oven for 10-12 minutes until heated through and bubbling. Remove from oven, sprinkle with extra breadcrumbs and bake a few more minutes until breadcrumbs are slightly browned. Serve with lemon wedges and toast points!

Habitat Today for Fish Tomorrow BUILDING A FUTURE FOR TEXAS MARINE HABITAT

Going Viral CCA Texas conservation projects are now on YouTube

CA Texas's Habitat Today for Fish Tomorrow (HTFT), continues to play a very active role in the restoration and creation of coastal habitat along the Texas coast. Since the program's inception in 2009, over \$3.4 million has been committed to this important restoration and creation work through twenty projects to date.

These projects include marsh and oyster reef restoration and creation in the bays of Texas; nearshore reefing projects in Freeport, Matagorda, Port O'Connor, Corpus Christi, and Port Mansfield; water inflow management work; and bay debris removal projects.

In 2013, CCA Texas staff has taken the next step to show its membership and the general public exactly what HTFT is doing. You can now visit *www.ccatexas.org* and click on the **Conservation tab.** There you will see the "Project Videos" link where you will be able to view all the great work of HTFT. To date, there are four great projects highlighted with video productions that include interviews with CCA staff and members, project partners, and the general recreational fishing public talking about the benefits of these projects and what is being done to complete them. This is an excellent opportunity for you to see how dollars raised in Texas are being used in Texas.

These pyramids along with other materials deployed will provide critical marine habitat for marine species, in particular red snapper and other fish species that are sought by recreational fishermen. Upper Coast

Presentation is critical now

As 2013 ended and 2014 began, we had some extremely cold temperatures. Fortunately, they came often enough to stage the fish near deep water which may have prevented a fish kill.

As February comes chilling in, the fish will be stacking up in six to eight feet of water, but NEAR shallow water. Through February and into the winds of March, some true winter hotspots should pay off. Top choices for cold, breezy days are the Blue Hole in Offatts Bayou, Chocolate Bayou and Halls Bayou. Check your map and look for the coves in West Bay that have guts in them. Be sure to slow your retrieve, and remember that during these generally cold months, presentation is critical. Try to remember exactly what you were doing when you got that last strike.

Be safe is the number one rule for these winter months. It's best to layer your clothes; overwarm and water resistant on top, warm in the middle, and cooler garb for the days when the sun decides to get you too warm. After all, this is Texas.

Another rule: numbers may not be large, but this is the time of year when you catch one to go on the wall. And, when the catching is great, consider the resource and send some back for the next trip. — Capt Ralph Frazier 281-337-0321 ralph2fish@aol.com

Fore Casts

Cold or not, go fish!

I look for this early winter pattern to continue into the next couple of months. During February and into late March, both Matagorda Bay West and East will be good destinations for those cold, windy days when you're gonna go, regardless.

There are some excellent charts and maps that can help even the old salt locate good locations. When drift fishing East Matagorda Bay, you want to stay over mud bottom in the early morning and really cold times.

Later on a cold day, or after temperatures have risen for a while, you can move to mud and shell mix. Check the chart, if you're not sure about the underwater terrain.

Late February and into March, on more pleasant days, wade fisherman can have good luck wading out from the shoreline and casting out to soft bottom. I have had good success with the new Norton Sand Shads, drifting and wading. I will also continue hitting the Colorado River, when the water temperatures stay low. Of course, you will know before you go, dress warm, maintain all safety precautions, and remember that the fish belong to all of us. Be courteous, and you'll find that the other guy will do the same.

Lower Coast By Capt. Mike Lowe

Top waters early, then red/white plastics February can be fine, even when windy and chilly, but March is one of my favorite times of the year.. Warming weather, sunny days, and waderless wades, (when we can) make for some good times on the water.

Along with the rising air temperature, warmer waters bring game fish out of the depths and onto the flats. It's hard to pick a favorite spot to fish this time of year because they all can be good.I definitely like going south. Green Island can hold good trout.

Wherever, I like throwing small top waters early and then switch to 1/8 ounce jig heads with red/white sand eel juniors. As always, be looking for nervous bait as you come into the area.

A lot of times I just like running the flats, scouting for the red fish herds. There is no rhyme or reason where they might be. When you do find them, don't shut down on top of the schools. Continue past the herds and circle back. They will usually form back together. Get out of the boat, throw gold spoons and be quiet when you're chasing them. Pick at the edges of the schools so you don't spook them and you should have success.

On a different note: One of Port Mansfield's local guides and a close personal find of mine, Capt. Jeff Neu was in a bad accident last month, breaking his leg in two places. For those of you that don't know Jeff, he is an asset to the fishing community and an excellent outdoorsman. Prayers go out to him and his family. Safe Boating and tight lines, -Capt.
