Enjoy this adaptation of Sherried Oysters from Acme Oyster House.

3 leeks, sliced and rinsed / 16 ounces fresh shucked oysters with liquid 6 T butter / 1 medium yellow onion diced / 4 cloves garlic minced / 1 cup cream sherry 2 T Tabasco sauce / 1 cup heavy whipping cream / 1 cup parmesan cheese Salt and pepper to taste / Toasted French bread for serving

Slice leeks in half lengthwise and slice thin across the grain, using all the white and some of green. Submerge the cut leeks in a bowl of cold water. Rinse to make sure all grit is removed. Drain oysters, saving juice.

Heat 4 Tablespoons of butter in large skillet on medium heat. Saute onions, leeks, and garlic until soft and clear. Add cream sherry and liquid from oysters and reduce until almost all liquid is gone.

Add heavy cream and continue to cook. Stir constantly with whisk until reduced, about 5 minutes. Add Tabasco, salt and pepper. Add parmesan cheese and heat through. Take off heat.

In another skillet, melt 2 tablespoons of butter and cook the fresh drained oysters for 3-5 minutes. Drain off excess liquid and add oysters to the cream sauce.

Serve as an appetizer on a toasted crostini or as a first course with French bread.







Summarizing 2012 HTFT efforts in Texas marine habitat

East Galveston Bay Oyster Restoration Project - \$3,700,000

CCA Texas has partnered with Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) to secure \$3,700,000 in funding to restore 130-acres of oyster reef in East Galveston Bay. CCA Texas originally funded \$500,000 for the project and then jointly secured an additional \$3,200,000 with TPWD for the project. All CIAP requirements have been fulfilled and TPWD is currently working with United States Fish and Wildlife Services (USFWS) and Texas General Land Office (Texas GLO) to finalize contracts. Once contracts are in place, the project work will begin and a final completion date of May 2013 is expected for the placement of materials. In addition to the placement of materials for the reefing site, an education program for local schools, a monitoring program and a public outreach program on the importance of oyster reefs are all part of the project.

Restoration of Cedar Bayou and Vinson Slough - \$520,000

CCA Texas has been active in the efforts to restore Cedar Bayou and Vinson Slough for many years, giving up to \$25,000 in the past for early stage feasibility, engineering and environmental studies. In February of 2012, CCA Texas' State Board approved \$500,000 in funding to assist Aransas County. An additional \$20,000 was committed to the project through the efforts of the Babes on the Bay fishing tournament, sponsored by the Aransas Bay Chapter, located in Rockport. This funding was a major step in "jump starting" the fund raising process for this \$7,400,000 project. To date approximately \$3,250,000 in funds have been secured and Aransas County and CCA Texas look forward to hearing the results of a \$3,000,000 grant request through the NRDA (Natural Resource Damage Assessment) process in December to continue moving forward with the ultimate goal of beginning construction April 16, 2013.

Matagorda Nearshore Artificial Reef -\$200,000

In June of 2009, CCA Texas approved an initial funding of \$35,000 for the new 160-acre nearshore reefing site located between Sargent and Matagorda. After some delays, the project was finally fully permitted in December of 2010. Since the original \$35,000 funding approval, CCA National's Building Conservation Fund has contributed an additional \$150,000 to the project and also secured \$15,000 from the Shimano Corporation making the total commitment \$200,000. After originally being scheduled to be reefed in 2012, the project has been

switched in priorities by TPWD so that the TWPD Artificial Reefing Program could seek full funds necessary to reef the entire site through the Deep Water Horizon NRDA process. An answer from the NRDA process should be forth coming in December 2012. At this time TPWD will move forward with their project package and bidding process in November with a separate package that will reef 200 structures. This will begin the reefing portion of this site at which time CCA can expense its commitment. This initial phase will be completed by August 2013.

Oyster Lake Shoreline Stabilization Project and Marsh Restoration Project (West Galveston Bay) - \$200,000

This project was approved in August of 2012 and is a partnership with the Galveston Bay Foundation. Once completed, approximately 5,200 linear feet of shoreline will be protected and will prevent West Galveston Bay from breaching Oyster Lake, an important estuarine lake in the Galveston Bay system. In addition, lost marsh areas will be replanted for restoration. CCA dollars will be leveraged for additional funds through state and federal grant programs that will be used for Phase II of the project, which are anticipated to be complete in late 2013 or first quarter of 2014.

Sargent area Shoreline Stabilization and Marsh Restoration Project - \$200,000 This project was approved in August of 2012 and is a partnership with Texas DU. This project will eventually create 3.0 miles of shoreline protection and restoration along the Gulf Coast Intra Coastal Waterway, just north of Sargent, Texas. This project will provide necessary protection for approximately 1,200-acres of marsh currently threatened by the quickly eroding shorelines. CCA dollars will be used as matching dollars and will help by providing for an additional 1,300 linear feet for breakwater, thus bringing the total linear footage of Phase I and II to 4,750 feet of breakwater. Phase I and II are expected to be completed by June 30, 2013. Other funding partners for this project in-clude NAWCA, The Meadows Foundation, DU and USFWS.

Corpus Christi Nearshore Artificial Reef - \$100,000

In November of 2011, CCA Texas approved \$100,000 in funding to the Corpus Christi Nearshore reefing project. This reefing site is a 160-acre site located in Texas state waters between Packery Channel and Port Aransas. This project will reef 400 pre-fabricated reef pyramids, making the site 50% reefed. The contract for this project has been awarded and work has begun by the contract con-

structing the structures. This project is due to be completed in August of 2013.

Copano Bay Oyster Reef Restoration at Lap Reef - \$75,000

CCA Texas is partnering with Harte Research Institute (HRI) to create a 1.5 acre oyster reef complex on Lap Reef, in Copano Bay, to enhance fish habitat. This project is part of a large mapping effort to identify and prioritize locations for oyster reef restoration based on long-term water quality and oyster health. Recycled materials will be used as base material for the site and it will then be topped with reclaimed oyster shells through a program initiated by Dr. Jennifer Pollack at Texas A&M Corpus Christi and HRI.

This project is being funded by CCA Texas through the CCA National Building Conservation Fund and should be completed during the 1st quarter of 2013.

Nueces Bay Delta Water Management System - \$70,000

CCA Texas has partnered with the Coastal Bend Bays and Estuaries Program (CBBEP) to install a water management system that will ensure water pumped into the delta stays in the delta and does not backflow into the Nueces River, thus bypassing this critical habitat. This project will install a water control gate type system in Rincon Bayou to keep water in the delta. CCA Texas approved \$70,000 funding to be used for matching funds in November of 2011. The project is currently in the final engineering stages and is awaiting approvals. The scheduled completion date is the 1st quarter of 2013.

Bird Island Cove Marsh Restoration (West Galveston Bay) - \$50,000

CCA Texas funded \$50,000 to this project in May 2011. This project will restore 52-acres within an existing 115-acre marsh site. CCA Texas dollars have been used as matching funds by TPWD to secure dollars from USFW Coastal Wetland Grants Program. All funds have been received and the project is in the final engineering stages with an estimated completion between the fourth quarter of 2013 and first quarter of 2014.

J. D. Murphree Wildlife Management Area Shoreline Stabilization - \$50,000

This project was originally funded in August of 2010 in the amount of \$50,000. This project is a partnership with Texas Ducks Unlimited to construct approximately 2,500 linear feet of breakwater along sensitive salt and fresh water marsh along the Gulf Coast Intra Coastal Waterway within the J. D. Murphree Wildlife Management area. Texas DU used the CCA commitment as leverage dollars to secure further funds from the North American Wetlands Conservation Act (NAWCA) that are being matched with Coastal Impact Assistance Program (CIAP) dollars. All NAWCA and CIAP dollars are now in place; contract finalization is being completed for the CIAP dollars; the project is expected to be bid by the end of the year or January 2013 and will be completed by June 30, 2013.

Goose Island State Park Marsh Restoration Project - \$50,000

CCÁ Texas has provided a total for \$50,000 in funding for this multi-phase project to restore 24 –acres of marsh located in Goose Island State Park. This project utilized beneficial use dredge materials to create marsh mounds inside of a levied system which will be eventually opened up to normal water flows, thus restoring 24-acres of lost marsh.

In Phase I of the project, twenty-five plus volunteers showed up to transplant various sea grasses from existing areas to the new marsh mounds in October of 2009. The volunteer effort was supplemented in January of 2010 by a professional effort and funded by CCA Texas. The project was a success and after receiving much needed rains this year, the grasses are growing well.

Phase II of the project met many challenges due to drought and salinity levels, but was finally professionally planted in 2012. CCA Texas once again funded this work bringing the total commitment to \$50,000.

Dickinson Bayou Marsh Restoration Project - \$25,000

CCÁ Texas funded \$25,000 to this project in May 2011. TPWD is continuing to seek funds for the project and they are currently waiting on notice form USFWS – CWPPRA 2013 funds, which will come on January 1, 2013. TWPD is also seeking funds from Texas FLO CMP grant dollars and those will be announced on January 1, 2013 as well. CCA Texas dollars are being used and matching dollars for the project.

Texas DU has stepped in and is going to complete the engineering phase of the project with assistance from NOAA as well. With the help of Texas DU and NOAA, engineering will be completed soon and project construction can be begun and completed in 2013.

CCA Texas and HRI establish first-ever Sportfish Research Center at Texas A&M Corpus Christi

The CCA has pledged \$500,000 in support of the center. The Harte Support Foundation is committing over \$300,000 to build a special purpose research vessel, plus

supporting equipment.

"It is an exciting opportunity to focus on the science that supports the multi-billion dollar recreational fishery that has flourished on the Texas coast and the Gulf of Mexico," stated Dr. Larry McKinney, HRI's Executive Director. "I could not think of a better partner than CCA Texas to make this dream a reality."

"We know that sound science is the foundation on which we must build our conservation efforts," concluded Robbie Byers, Executive Director of CCA Texas. "HRI brings that credibility and expertise to this project as no other institute could do. We are really excited about what the future holds for this research center."

"As researchers, we need the ability to

he ability to step back out of the trees and see the whole forest in order to address the truly pressing problems facing sport fisheries," noted Dr. Greg Stunz, endowed chair for Ocean Health at HRI and the director of the new center. "It is exciting for me and my team to finally have the resources to meet this challenge. We know this is just the beginning of a science-based coalition that will advance our ability to assure the future of this fishery."

Many CCA members will remember that Dr. Stunz was the first-ever recipient of a CCA scholarship.

Altogether, more than \$1,000,000 will be committed to launching the first ever dedicated research center for the study of sportfish in the western Gulf of Mexico.

All I want for Christmas is a 10 lb. Trout

Galveston Bay fishing has been nothing less than spectacular this fall and as we head toward Christmas and the New Year I expect the fishing to remain top notch. To add to that, don't be surprised to get a gift or two in the form of a large speckled trout.

As we make the transition from working birds and following schools of fish feeding on various types of smaller bait fish to the winter time gorging pattern of the larger trout, expect the best of both worlds, catching a lot of fish as well as having the opportunity to catch that speckled trout you have always wanted for Christmas!

I would key on two areas of Galveston Bay. The first would be Trinity Bay. The wind would dictate which side, east or west, that I would fish. I would also plan my fishing trips right before the passing cold fronts and after the front as soon as the wind stops. My second choice would be East Bay. Same pre- and post front philosophy as well as letting the wind direction thi you which shoreline, north or south, to fish. Pay attention to the tidal movement in and out, which is exaggerated by each passing cold front. The tide level will help you fine tune the areas you need to key on.

Paul Brown Originals give you a great shot at catching both numbers and quality. The 51 series MirroLures are old school, but deadly. MirroLure She Dogs would be my choice of top water baits. My color of choice is chartreuse and white.

Remember to respect our fisheries and your fellow fisherman.

Easy fishing is history for the year

Cold weather and cooling tides are moving in with Old Man Winter, as you receive this issue of *Currents*. The redfish run along the jetties at Port O'Connor is history; flounder have moved out into the Gulf; tailing reds in West Matagorda Bay are rare and trout can be as scarce as snow along the middle Texas coast. But with the cooler water temperatures comes the opportunity to find reds and trout bunched up and easy to catch if you're in the right place at the right time.

Let last year guide us to this year: I was guiding a duck hunt, fish hunt along Matagorda Island. The morning shoot was excellent for redheads and pintails, and the afternoon bite at the mouth of Contee Lake was better than expected. Reds were up on the flats adjacent to the channel drop, and specks, lots of them, were holding along the cut leading into Contee. Trout were best on 3.5-inch white-chartreuse Egret Bayou Chubs. Reds were all over 5-inch long Egret Wedgetails. The trick was to rig the soft plastics on 1/8 or 1/16 ounce jig heads. By the way, that 5inch Egret Wedgetail is one of the hottest lures I've used in some time. This past summer and fall we used them to smoke reds in the backwater lakes of Port O'Connor. The key was to rig them on a weedless 5/0 hook and reel the Wedgetails on a slow retrieve.

During cold water months there are three areas you want to concentrate on. First, at the mouths of estuary lakes feeding into the bays. Second are the spots along the flats where they drop off into deep water channels. And third, never underestimate the power of jigs worked over soft mud and shell in 4 to 6 feet of water. – Capt. Robert Sloan

Now it's time for Mr. Winter fishing

December brings new life to our system, with reds moving back on the gin clear sand flats, flounder staging for their exit to the Gulf, and specks finally starting to put on shoulders, while gorging themselves on shrimp, mullet and crab. Pintails, widgeon, and redheads are here by the thousands and duck hunters are enjoying the numbers. Personally, I wish it could stay Fall forever, but we are now in Mr. Winter fishing!

The last few years, we have been whacked by very few really bad fronts that lower the temperature to critical mass for our skinny water system. The best fishing will be a day or two after a strong front, including wind returning to the southeast. As the water warms, we find reds and specks roaming the sand flats presenting ample opportunities for "hunting" or sight casting, my favorite type of fishing.

Captain Rene Hinojosa (see this issue's front cover) recommends sight casting at big reds and extra-large specks. Norton Sand Eels and gold spoons usually rule, but always have a Mansfield mauler and a Gulp ready, because sometimes it's the only thing that will turn on the bite. Remember: When the weather gets really foul and cold, there is something about the opportunity to land that fish of a lifetime that will make you suit up and go.

Port Mansfield said goodbye to longtime resident, Laguna Madre activist and professional guide Walt Kittelberger this past October. He and his wife Nancy moved to Oregon to start a new adventure. Walt has been a champion of preserving the Lower Laguna Madre for over 20 years, fighting everything from the shrimp farms to the development of Padre Island. He and his Lower Laguna Madre Foundation have successfully fought and won many epic battles to preserve the pristine qualities of our beloved Laguna.
