Two new reefs completed, two more on the way to your neighborhood

Aransas Bay and Copano Bay Reef Expansions constructed

wo oyster reef restoration projects led by Harte Research Institute (HRI) and Texas A&M Corpus Christi (TAMUCC) were recently expanded by 1.5 acres, each through a \$150,000 contribution by CCA Texas and approximately \$80,000 in funds from Gulf of Mexico Foundation, Fish America Foundation, the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation, and NOAA. This project expanded the existing 3.8 acre project in Copano Bay to 5.3 acres

and the Aransas Bay project from 6.5 acres to 8 acres. A 3-dimensional reef construction with high vertical relief was used in this effort to enhance oyster and finfish abundance while minimizing sedimentation.

"We are excited about the opportunity to partner with CCA to restore important oyster reef habitat in Texas coastal bend bays," said Dr. Jennifer Pollack, Texas A&M University Corpus Christi. "We anticipate that creation of this new oyster habitat will provide key benefits to Copano and Aransas Bays, including enhanced recreational fishing opportunities and improved water quality."

The construction of both reefs will be similar in that they will both have 12 mounds within the 1.5 acres. All 12 mounds will have a crushed

### WE WANT YOU! TO FISH FOR US!



CCA Texas and Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) are looking for volunteers to help with pre-construction and post construction fishing surveys for the East Galveston Bay Oyster Reef restoration project. This \$3.7 million project will restore approximately 140 acres of oyster reef in the East Galveston Bay System. The areas targeted for restoration include 1 location on Hannah's Reef, 2 locations on Pepper Grove and 2 locations on Middle Reef.

This is effort is an important piece of the project and we need plenty of volunteers. You will be a fishing scientist and your efforts will be critical in understanding the benefits of oyster reef restoration up and down the Texas coast. The fishing periods will be seasonal periods during the months of June to August, September to November, December to February and March to May. Pre-construction efforts will take place through the end of 2013 and post construction efforts will take place beginning June 2014 through 2015.





# Great Foods / Food Editor Ellen Ohmstede CAESAR ROASTED FISH FILETS

2 large garlic cloves / 1/ 4 cup chopped fresh parsley 1 T anchovy paste / 2 t Dijon mustard / 1 cup mayonnaise 1 T grated lemon zest / 3 T freshly squeezed lemon juice / Salt and pepper / 6-8 fish filets / 1/2 cup chopped scallions (white and green part) / 2 T olive oil / 3 T drained capers / Lemon wedges for serving

Preheat oven to 500 degrees. Line a cookie sheet with foil.

For the sauce, place garlic, parsley, anchovy paste, and mustard in a food processor. Pulse until garlic is minced. Add mayonnaise, lemon zest, lemon juice, 1 t salt and ½ t pepper and blend until smooth.

Place the fish on the pan and sprinkle both sides generously with salt and pepper. Set aside one third of the sauce to serve with the cooked fish. Spread the sauce on both sides of the fish. Sprinkle with Scallions and allow to stand for 10 minutes.

Roast fish for 10-12 minutes until opaque in center. Cover fish with foil and allow to rest for about 10 minutes.

Meanwhile, heat the oil in a small pan until very hot add the capers and cook for 30 seconds, until they start to pop and are a little crisp. Serve the fish with the remaining sauce, capers and lemon wedges.

concrete base and then three will be topped with recycled oyster shells, 3 with river rock, 3 with limestone and 3 will be made up entirely of crushed concrete.

The vertical relief of these mounds will be 1 foot, and the expected results of these projects are increased fish habitat, enhanced oyster, finfish and crustacean abundance, and an increase in recreational fishing opportunities.

The Aransas Bay reef is located approximately 200 yards off of the Goose Island State Park Beach Front just west of the pier. The Copano Bay reef is located in the Lap Reef complex. Both of these areas provide excellent fishing opportunities for recreational fishermen with and without boats.

"CCA Texas and Habitat Today for Fish Tomorrow (HTFT) are excited to be a part of this project," commented Jay Gardner, HTFT Chairman. "Oyster reefs are an important part of the marine ecosystem that provides fisheries habitat, water filtration, and a tasty meal for those who enjoy fresh oysters."

# Two nearshore reefing projects funded

CCA Texas funds \$100,000 to create Port O'Connor Nearshore Reef

CCA Texas Executive Board approved \$100,000 in funding to secure and prepare a nearshore reefing site out of Port O'Connor. This funding will cover the

costs to secure the US Army Corps of Engineers Permit (USACE) and continues with the HTFT vision to have a nearshore reef out of every port in Texas.

This site will be located

in Texas state waters and the permitting process should be completed by the end of TPWD's 2014 fiscal year. While the permitting process is underway, CCA Texas will be working with TPWD to help secure temporary staging sites for materials in the Port O'Connor area.

## **Upper Coast**

#### By Capt. Walt Kalinowski

#### Time for birds and slicks

Considering the great variety of the Upper Texas coast, you can tailor your fishing choice to fit the conditions. I decide on the Sabine area, a Galveston Bay or Matagorda Bays, depending on the fish. Oh yeah, and the weather. Bad old Southwest wind? Head for the protected, small bays. You will find me near Smith Point or the back end of East Bay. When conditions suggest the Matagorda Bays area, I work Bird Island a lot, and Chinquapin.

When the October temp hits 75, light Southeast or Northeast winds will let you chase the birds and slicks in the big waters. Try the Wells early, and be aware that fish don't like crowds and boat activity. A group of boats may be working a slick, which puts the fish down. Let the crowd have it, but wait further down wind, and you'll find the fish are still hungry. Also, you'll find the little trout near the surface of a slick, but get a heavier lure down and the better fish will find it. On the other hand, a topwater like the Skitterwalk Jr. or a bone Super Spook (I paint mine with an orange head and a red behind) can bring the bigger fish up through a slick.

Lures: I like the Hoagie Diablos in limetreuse, pumpkin, Texas roach. Below 70 degrees, plum and a copperhead with a black back seem to work better. If things get really slow, go to the Cajun Thunder popping rig, with Gulp about 24" below. Live shrimp may bring more fish to deal with, but fewer big fish are better.

Of course, cooler water in October and November means shallower fish, so consider wade fish regions. Charts can guide you, but as elsewhere, pay attention to conditions and the weather.

Remember the regulations—the regs are there to help the resource. Don't take more than you really need. That big, big trout deserves to go back for further duty. And, courtesy on the water is catching.

Middle Coast

#### When? October and November!

"What's the best time of year to come down and fish with you?" is a question I often get, and my answer is always the same: October and November! I love the other ten months, but for overall enthusiasm, it's these two months for several reasons. Most obvious is the water cooling down from shorter days and cooler weather coming on the heels of a blazing hot summer—the fish become energized and put up a really good fight.

Another one though is that general good feeling of 'Ahhh...Fall!' which clicks the 'get outdoors' switch in your head for some darn fine fishing and the highly anticipated duck season for our area.

Of course, tides fluctuate due to the weather. High activity in the tropics as water gets pushed ashore from low pressure systems can then can rush out of the bays with an early strong cool front. The key is to roll with the changes and adjust for changes in the wind and weather—and water levels!

The Dog Days are gone and the popular game fish will respond to a dose of topwater plugs (SuperSpook Jrs being my favored one with hooks switched to singles), soft plastics (TTKillers/Saltwater Assassins/Hackberry Hustlers and the like) and spoons (gold over grass, silver over sand).

The shrimp migration is now in full swing and the Harvest Moon is lighting up the night skies. Yes, the fish are eating at night during this time, but pay attention more to the phases of the 'bite' and you will reap the benefits of a more productive angling effort. The four events are Sun Rise, Sun Set, Moon Rise and Moon Set. And typically, 30-45 minutes on either side of these four daily events can lead you to the fish.

Of course, the best time to go fishing is when you can go! However, if you arm yourself with more information on what the fish are known to do, you will maximize your time on the water and marvel friends at your computer screen with cool screen saver photos of your last outing!—Capt. #### **Lower Coast**

#### Hunt the flats, consider topwaters

It's finally gonna start cooling down here in South Texas, but the fishing will only continue to heat up. The next two months can yield some heavy stringers for those willing to hunt the flats. Early October, shallow waters will begin to hold large numbers of trout and reds cruising and looking for their next meal. These fish also show a willingness to hit surface lures through the day

This is certainly the most fun way to catch specks and reds, in my opinion. Ask Miller Bassler, who switched, as he told the Currents editor, from a plastic worm to a "Big Chartreuse SheDog...BIG!" Sure enough, a BIG trout hit the plug. Miller released the trout, though a bit earlier than he planned.

On bright sunshine-filled days, look for success on redfish with a gold spoon. The trout will be getting fatter as they get ready for the colder months ahead. During the months of October and November, trout can be found in the waist-deep potholes adjacent to deeper water. Be sure to look for pods of mullet. Where you find the bait, you will also find the game fish.

Into November, we will also begin to see bird activity in the flats. Often times you will only see two or three birds 'sitting' on the fish. I've caught some of my biggest trout where a single seagull was sitting on a flat. These birds are opportunistically waiting on a bait fish to surface.

For those looking for some fantastic wing shooting, October and November is great down south. We have fields planted for white wing dove along with some of the best mourning dove action in the entire state. There are lots of birds this year. As November nears, expect the sky to get full of ducks. We have some great duck hunting on the Laguna Madre. Redheads, pintails and wigeons will dominate our straps.

As always, when you venture outdoors anywhere, remember that the Texas Lower Coast is a big place full of fish and adventures, and can be also be a place full of misadventures. Go, but know before you go. —Capt. Danny Neu 979-942-0165 dneucharters@yahoo.com


