Flounder Season Reminder

Way back in May of 2020, the Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission (TPWC) adopted changes to flounder regulations in efforts to help the struggling population. You may remember that effective September 2020, the minimum size was increased from 14 to 15 inches. At that same meeting, the TPWC also voted in favor of a fall closure to allow spawning females to migrate to the Gulf. However, they decided not to make that rule effective until 2021, citing consideration of the economic impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. This rule change was likely forgotten by a few anglers, hence this reminder.

Flounder Regulations

Daily Bag: 5 fish Min Length: 15 inches Max Length: No limit Daily bag is 5 fish except Nov 1 - Dec 14

(fishery closed; bag limit = 0). Possession limit = the daily bag.

The TPWC also directed staff to: 1) Move towards real-time reporting of commercial landings to ensure that all flounder landed under a commercial finfish license are reported to the department, and 2) Further study a potential slot limit for the fishery to increase spawning



biomass. In closing discussions, then Vice-Chairman (now current Chairman) Arch H. "Beaver" Aplin of Lake Jackson provided supportive comments on the continued need to provide some relief to the fishery through the flounder stock enhancement program. Shane Bonnot, CCA Texas Advocacy Director, provided comments to the Commission citing concerns for the continued declines and need for action to conserve southern flounder. "CCA Texas appreciates the Commission taking action that considers what is best for the resource while remaining sensitive to the economic impacts that the current pandemic has had on recreational fishing guides, anglers and businesses supportive of the recreational fishing industry," stated Bonnot. "Over the past 15 years our membership has donated over \$1 million to support larval research and flounder stock enhancement.

"We are committed to continuing efforts that will improve this fishery and provide opportunities for the recreational angler." "So, from November 1 through December 14, you can fish for flounder, but you must let them go. Practice catch and release; Let them spawn during this critical part of their journey to the Gulf of Mexico."

Coastal Hatcheries Stocking Update

Lexas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD)




Figure 1: 2021 TPWD Coastal Stocking Totals through mid-September

Coastal Fisheries Enhancement has been firing
on all cylinders this summer, releasing over 23
million speckled trout and red drum into Texas bay
systems (see Figure 1). Going into the production
season, which typically starts in mid-April, hatcheries
received an outpouring of support from groups and
individuals such as CCA Texas, West End Anglers,
Bayou City Angler and TPWD volunteers. Couple that
support with professional biologists and technicians
motivated to fulfill their mission and great things are
bound to happen.

To top things off, TPWD staff have been taking additional measures to increase stocking locations and recruitment of fingerlings, including utilizing vessels to place fingerlings directly into estuaries with optimal conditions for survivability. TPWD staff have stocked fingerlings directly into Big Pasture and Goat Island in East Galveston Bay as well as Christmas Bay, Bastrop Bayou, Greens Lake, Nicks Lake and Salt Lake in West Galveston Bay. East Matagorda Bay has seen boat stockings directly adjacent to Brown Cedar Cut, the backside of Redhouse Reef and the southside of the Spoil Islands near Flounder Cut. And of course, the Laguna Madre Bay systems have seen their fair share of boat stockings in prime seagrass habitat as we have highlighted in this video.

Septembert hrough November are typically great months for trout spawning in the hatcheries, so as TPWD enters the final months of their fingerling production season, you can expect that trout stockings will substantially increase.

The objective of CCA Texas is to conserve, promote and enhance the present and future availability of our coastal resources for the benefit and enjoyment of the general public. We are proud to support TPWD Coastal Fisheries in their efforts to enhance our fisheries

Putting fingerlings back where fish need to be





Caught Redhanded! K Reports from TP&W Game Wardens

On August 24, 2021 shortly after midnight, a Galveston County Game Warden received a call reporting people using a gill net at East Beach on Galveston Island and keeping speckled trout. The warden quickly responded to the location and met up with the caller.

The caller stated that the individuals were still on location and actively working a gill net. With the information provided, the warden was able to quickly locate the individuals who were actively working a gill net. After a short period of time, the individuals began to pull in the gill net and pack up their gear to head home for the night.

The warden then made contact with six individuals once they got to their vehicles. Upon investigation, it was discovered that a gill net was the only device used to catch the fish and none of the individuals possessed a fishing license. In total, a 150 quart cooler was seized containing 37 speckled trout, 8 sharks, 8 black drum, 7 sheepshead, 7 ladyfish, 1 red drum and various other species. Multiple citations and warnings were issued. Case pending.

in fish and wildlife law enforcement. The program has been very successful in giving students an accurate idea of what a conservation-related career with the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department entails and we are proud to be part of it. Below are letters from this year's recipients.

Marco Pena: I am a Junior Agribusiness Major at Texas A&M University. This summer I had the tremendous honor of working as a Texas Game Warden Intern in Cameron County. The online CURRENTS newsletter requires no printing nor postage, and delivery is almost instantaneous. An email to members contains a link, with the full newsletter a click away.


Apart from the cost difference, there are reasons a member could appreciate an internet version of the publication.

- Another big plus—your CURRENTS Newsletter is now as close as your laptop or your cellphone.



The Aransas Bay chapter sent some fine photos this time, so the Editor used them all, large.



hat was labeled as 'A STAR of Different Colors' has finally come to a close. The year presented many different struggles that the tournament had to overcome, but STAR volunteers were able to pull off a very successful tournament. Nobody can put the 2021 STAR experience in words better than the man who has been the STAR Director since inception, Bill Kinney:

"The 32nd annual STAR is a tribute to YOU, and the righteous pride we all feel as true conservationists. Following the deadly freeze, CCA Texas had to act fast, all hands on deck, to build a new STAR plan to help our impacted species, especially speckled trout. Radical moves were required, right then, to offset the damage done. We knew our passion to fish is strong, but did we have what it takes to catch....and not keep? The results are in. We are winning! No one anywhere could match the magnificent restraint CCA anglers demonstrated in behalf of our precious resources. You held back, without government intervention in most cases, to give these fish a break....sensing that our combined efforts would sooner accelerate recovery back to the highest saltwater gamefish populations in the country. Coupled with quick action and stepped-up hatchery releases of 4.8 million speckled trout since the freeze, our mutual angling restraint proves yet again the CCA mission statement is solid. We, as CCA members, are indeed dedicated to the conservation of marine life. Kudos to every single one of you. We are headed the right direction, and faster.

As a testament, our first Catch/Clip/Release format was a resounding success. Thanks to your support almost 55,000 folks fished the tournament. NEW anglers coming into our sport continues strong. More kids hit the water (Note: a special thanks to you parents for ensuring the next wave of future conservationists). Yes, we are aware many would like to see the return of more actual competition versus only tagged-fish catches. As we await results from the TPWD fall gill-net surveys, we will determine which species can safely return. It is likely you can expect a 2022 hybrid of this year's model as these fisheries recover.

Nonetheless, the credit this year goes to you, our members. Since inception, CCA has sought to educate our angling base on both the perils of overfishing and the benefits of marine conservation. YOUR response, in our drastic time of need, is the best there is. No matter what, we are FOR THE FISH.

With over triple the number of tagged fish released, tournament action kept us hopping this year. A record 37 tagged fish were caught with winners capturing more big prizes than ever.



Upper Coast

Adjust and enjoy the trip
The arctic blast of 2020: our huge upper coast complex fared better than most of the Texas coast, thanks to many deep regions and Gulf water inflows. The resource suffered, but we're seeing evidence of full recovery. In late September, several "cold" fronts have already moved through. An early winter? Large numbers of small trout and flounder are schooling and apparently moving toward Gulf passes. Maybe the fish are getting smarter or adjusting to the rules of Mother Nature. We'll do the same and enjoy the trip.

Several adjustment suggestions for October and November: 1) You don't have to get on the water at dawn-traffic and launching early is tough, and it's the cool time of the year. 2) Charts, whether paper or phone app are invaluable. 3) The phone app MYRADAR has allowed me to consider and avoid local weather problems. 4) Gather your fishing gear early. I like top waters all day, at least in shallow areas. Try my favorite, a Skitterwalk medium, slow. For deeper regions, try Hoagies, very slow. 5) Before you go, check those trailer axles and TPWD requirements. 6) On the water, you will have weather gear for all, and consider the safety of your crew. 7) Consider the most important value of your trip: the resource.

We suggest sending the big spotted girls and spot tails back over 20 inches. Mother Nature, and future Texas fishermen would appreciate it. Stay safe, take time to enjoy life. –Capt. Walt Kalinowski 713-304-7091 capwaltk@yahoo.com

Middle Coast

Capt. Scott Null

Your favorite time of year to fish? If I had to choose one month to fish, it would be October 15 through November 15. The crowds of summer have dispersed, the weather is typically outstanding, and the fish are feasting in anticipation of leaner times to come. As I write this, we have just enjoyed the first cool front, a good one for September. Between that and the refreshing flush the bays received from hurricane Nick, the fall season should be kicking into gear. The redfish will be prowling the marshes searching maturing shrimp as those tasty crustaceans prepare to migrate to the bays and eventually offshore.

Early on, smaller schools of reds will be pushing the shoreline cord grass dislodging shrimp from their hideouts. As the fronts continue to roll through, the shrimp will start gathering in the marsh lakes where schools of reds and trout can be found working them over. Flounder will be stacking up on the marsh drains to prepare for their own migration and feasting on the abundant bait.

With each passing front, more and more of those shrimp will move into the bays. This is when fishing the birds will pick up. Large schools of trout will push the bait to the surface as they feed, attracting the attention of every seagull in the vicinity—along with a whole bunch of boats. If we all ease in by drifting or employing a trolling motor everyone can get in on the action. Don't plow in on the big motor or push too tight to the school and they'll stay up longer.

So, the weather is cooler, the crowds have thinned and the fish are biting. It doesn't get much better. —Capt. Scott Null www.Captainscottnull.com_Capt. Lower Coast

Mother Nature adjusts—again Coming up in October, we can expect higher water levels. Reds will be schooling up on sand beds and posting up to go back offshore. Conditions will be good depending of course on Mother Nature's cold fronts. A day or so after one of the big ones, conditions can be just right for drifting, watching and sight casting to hungry reds. As we have eased along the flats recently, we're seeing a few big trout and lots of reds from 18" to 22".

Rain in the Lower Laguna Madre region has been abundant—some 19" above normal. Maybe that's why the bait fish numbers and the blue crab hatch has been fantastic. We're seeing some monster blue crabs. Fly fishermen should score with crab imitations. Reelers should do likewise when choosing lures; match the crab hatch might be a good slogan. Of course, dedicated top-water afficianados can expect their favorite lures to produce, while remembering that slow is cool in the cooler conditions.

As October fades into November, bigger tides will be along, pushing the gamefish back into the flats. Shrimp patterns and crustacean look-alikes on heavier jig heads, moved slow and slower will be good choices.

Of course, the freeze hurt the LLM, but the prospects for an excellent recovery are apparent. Making that happen is in our hands. We'll remember to practice CPR and encourage friends to send the big fish back for further duty. — Capt. Texas Dove/Quail w/wild rice

For four, if you're a good shot. I like a cast iron skillet for initial cooking and an oven for final touches. Cut 1 jalapeño into 4 strips, and cut 4 slices of bacon in half. To prepare birds: top each with 1 strip of jalapeño and some shredded cheese, then wrap entire bird with 1/2 piece of bacon. Next, secure with a skewer or toothpick. Continue until all breasts are wrapped.

The wild rice takes the longest to prepare, but worth it. 1.5 cups wild rice and 4.5 cups of water heated to a boil. Add rice, reduce heat to a simmer, cover and cook for 45 minutes. While the wild rice cooks, heat three tablespoons of butter and three of vegetable oil. You'll save this for the gravy.

Season the quail or dove with salt and pepper and brown the birds for two to three minutes per side in the hot oil. You aren't trying to cook the game through at this point, just browning the surface for flavor. To assemble the dish, pour the gravy over the rice and stir the two together. Nestle the browned birds into the rice then place the dish into a 350-degree oven for 30 minutes. Serve with your favorite veggies and a beverage from the Texas Hill Country. —Sam Caldwell
