More Oysters

The Oyster – a sessile organism that creates its own habitat with a remarkable ability to filter water, removing excess organic matter from our bay systems. One single oyster can filter up to 50 gallons of water per day and one acre of oyster reef provides \$6,500 in denitrification services annually. Oyster reefs stabilize bottom sediments, reduce shoreline erosion, diminish wave energy and protect wetlands, historically serving as horizontal levees that provide in excess of \$20 billion worth of storm protection annually to Gulf Coast businesses and communities.

In their natural environment, oyster reefs do almost all the same things as coral reefs. They are refuge. They are food. They are habitat. Over 300 aquatic species utilize oyster reefs, and research has

shown that oyster reefs support nearly 4.5 times the aquatic biomass than seagrasses and 11.5 times the aquatic biomass found along marsh edge habitat.

Texas oyster reefs are a critical component of the natural landscape, no different than the trees of the Piney Woods, the brush in the South Texas plains or the wooded mountains of the Trans-Pecos. Without vibrant oyster reefs, you have an underwater landscape that's flat and featureless with nowhere for critters to hide and little to eat.

It may be difficult to imagine but there was a time where oyster reef systems expanded across entire bay systems, and at low tides, wildlife, livestock and humankind would utilize these reefs systems for navigation between land masses. In the last 100 years, due to storms, mining, dredging and commercial oyster fishing, you'd be hard pressed to find any reef system that has any resemblance of its former self. Much of the discussion recently is focused on the immense shift in oyster fishing pressure to the Texas middle coast and the observable impact it is having on oyster reef systems.

As the transient oyster fishery moves en masse to smaller harvest areas, we are witnessing these changes in real time. The 2nd Chain of Islands, Ayres Reef, Ranch House Reef, Beldon's Reef, Cedar Reef, Carlos Reef, and multiple reef systems in Matagorda, San Antonio, Copano and Aransas Bays are being unnaturally altered in both size and structure. Repeatedly dragged and scraped by the oyster dredges, public oyster reefs are being toppled and scattered, drastically changing their structural nature. Reefs that used to be measured vertically in feet are now measured in inches or lost all together. Reefs that historically would extend to the water surface at low tide are now worked down to the bay bottom, making them more vulnerable to being covered by mud and silt.

Anglers, birders, and coastal residents can attest. Previously wadable reefs are now inaccessible. Reefs that once offered sanctuary for shore birds no longer breach the water's surface. Reefs that used to protect shorelines from erosion are no longer high enough to absorb wave energy across the bays.

• It is time to prioritize the structural and ecological value of reefs.

• It is time to safeguard existing reefs and boldly expand current restoration efforts.

• It is time to expand the legally approved state bay-bottom lease program (certificate of location) and promote increased participation in cultivated oyster mariculture (oyster farming).

Public oyster reefs need our help. We need to remain vigilant and patient as we work together to increase sustainability of a fishery that means so much to the health of our bay systems. Bay Closings Considered: Public Comments In Order

At their March 23-24 meeting, the Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission (TPWC) will consider prohibiting the harvest of oysters in Carlos Bay, Mesquite Bay, and Ayres Bay. The closure to oyster harvest would protect ecologically sensitive and unique oyster habitat from the negative biological impacts of increased harvest pressure. <u>Per TPWD</u>, the ecological importance and sensitivity of these oyster reefs coupled with the historically high harvest pressure and highly variable oyster relative abundance makes this minor bay complex a candidate for permanent closure from harvest.

HABITAT TODAY FOR FISH TOMORROW

Deployments Continue at Nearshore Reefing Sites on Upper Texas Coast By John Blaha

Texas Parks and Wildlife Department's (TPWD) Nearshore Reefing Program recently completed additional nearshore reefing efforts at the Sabine HI20 and Galveston's Big Man and Kate's sites. TPWD contracted with Laredo Construction to deploy a total of 150 pyramids into the Sabine HI20 site and 1,000 pyramids and 255 slab reefs (low profile) into the Big Man and Kate's sites. The December 2021 deployment included the 150 pyramids into Sabine HI20, 500 into Big Man's, and 70 pyramids and 100 slab reefs into the Kate's site. Laredo Construction is now in the process of assembling the balance of 430 pyramids and 155 slab reefs which will be deployed into the Kate's site once construction is completed.

Temporary Spotted Seatrout Regulations Approved

At their January meeting, the Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission (TPWC) passed temporary regulation changes for spotted seatrout, with a beginning target date of March 10. The new rules reduce the spotted seatrout bag limit to 3 fish and restrict the allowable size to 17-23 inches.

The goal of this rule is to leave more spawning fish in the water for two spawning seasons to help the populations recover quickly from the 2021 winter storm. These regulation changes affect all coastal water bodies south of FM 457 in Sargent and expire August 31, 2023. You can listen to the entire January TPWC meeting by clicking *this link.*






Caught Redhanded! ل Reports from TP&W Game Wardens

One redfish becomes two oversize reds and four flounder

On 12/13/21 Jefferson County Game Wardens Joshua Sako and Jamal Allen observed a vehicle leaving a popular fishing spot on Pleasure Island in Port Arthur, Texas. They stopped the vehicle for a traffic violation along Highway 82, observed fishing poles in the back of the vehicle and asked the driver if he had caught any fish. The driver replied that he had just caught one redfish. He gave the wardens consent to search the back of the vehicle and they came across two flounder in a 5-gallon bucket. There was another five-gallon bucket stacked under that bucket that contained two more flounder.

The driver received multiple citations for possession of flounder in a closed season plus restitution for each flounder, a citation for possession of oversized red drum without tag, and warnings for traffic violations.



On 1/3/22, Harris County Warden Jeff Putnam received an Operation Game Thief (OGT) complaint regarding multiple suspects working gill nets in the Bishop Fiorenza Lake and Wildlife Sanctuary. The suspects departed the area





before Warden Putnam arrived, but left behind their set nets and assorted supplies. Working with the local Harris County Superintendent, arrangements were made to monitor the area for further activity.

On 1/4/22, the complainant reported seeing the suspects in the area again. Working with the Harris County Superintendent, Warden Derrick Lopez was able to respond from nearby and apprehend the two violators in the act of running the gill net in a protected area. Cases pending.

• In the Social Media Happenings section, links directly open up to posts on our social media platforms.



Leave it better than you found it Abandoned Crab Traps By Chris Smisek

Some twenty years ago I received a call from Ronnie Luster, asking if I could help TPWD Game Warden Robert Dominguez retrieve abandoned crab traps for a day. That day opened my eyes to a different world. Warden Robert and his partner taught me what a day in the life of a Texas Game Warden was all about and how to help the saltwater resource I loved. I could have never imagined the damage an abandoned crab trap can do over such a brief period.

We picked up dozens of abandoned traps, some new, some old. We picked up one that had a dead crab shell, another with an eco-system of live fishes and crabs. I was amazed at what each one had left alive in it. We even found one

with a trapped live gamefish. I remember how irritated I was that one of my sought-after game fishes was caught and doomed by a crab trap. That day, I was more than willing to help, but could do little but watch and learn from a pro.

Through the years, I found one needs a good pair of rubber gloves that are long enough to all but reach your elbows, rubber boots, a tee handle 4-foot J-hook to use as a trap grappler, an old pair of waders and layered clothing, a cheap blue tarp to help protect my boat deck, a few old ropes, a couple of energetic volunteers, an ice chest with water and refreshments, a good back, a good back brace and plenty of patience. Picking up derelict traps can be dangerous as every inch of those darn things are sharp and full of bad voodoo bacteria. There is no rush, just one at a time and enjoy the moment. It is hard work but at the end of the day, there are nothing but smiles and accolades from everyone involved. It is also helpful to have four on a boat to work in pairs and have time off occasionally. There is a great sense of accomplishment one gets by saving the life of anything in our time here on this beautiful planet Earth and watching whatever is still alive swim off as you release the contents of the retrieved traps is rewarding beyond what my words can relate.

As time has passed, I see fewer and fewer derelict and/or abandoned traps in the bays. Heck, we used to use them to tell us how shallow the water was. If they were less than halfway under, we'd get the heck out of there but now, they are becoming harder and harder to find. Some I see are there due to an unintentional prop cutting of the buoy

rope by recreational anglers and/or storms blowing them into the grassland and the crabbers cannot find them. It is hard for me to imagine that the crabbers are leaving them purposefully at a cost of over \$40 a piece!

After almost 20 years of helping,

mostly with the same group of friends, we have bonded in a unique way and look forward every year to helping again.

One year, during the most severe weather day we have encountered, we delivered our haul to Charlie's Bait Dock as Capt. Everett Johnson was about to leave. He was the official counter and told me afterwards that, "I lost count and you either came in with 96 or 97 traps!" That stands as a record for one boat, one haul, in one day...and we even have pictures!

If you want to walk a bay shoreline with someone ahead of you and someone behind from Sabine Pass to the Rio Grande, get involved in the Annual Crab Trap Pickup Weekend and you will then feel what true satisfaction feels like. Bet you will be back the next year!

Ronnie's passionate conservation efforts have made a positive and lasting impact on our Texas Coast. Thank you, Ronnie.



A Twenty-year Tradition Continues

The comprehensive and systematic approach to removing traps has been expanded to include San Antonio, Aransas, Lavaca and Matagorda Bays. Search areas are defined out of Port O'Connor, Charlies, Seadrift, Austwell, Rockport, Port Lavaca & Palacios, with removal activities continuing throughout the closure period. Funding for this year's effort will come from a NOAA Marine Debris Removal grant. Volunteers are asked to collect data on each trap removed and mark its location using a cell phone-based app. This data will help to determine the root causes of trap dereliction. Send the email address of the data coordinator in your crew so we can create a username and password for accessing the data program. And, the mobile phone of the Captain for last minute changes and on-the-water emergencies. Allan Berger is the contact.

Save the date: February 19. The closure period is February 18-27. In case of bad weather, Feb. 26 is the fallback day.

Although traps can be removed at any time during the 10-day closure, several partner organizations will be holding volunteer events on February 19th with February 26th acting as a back-up day if a cancellation occurs due to weather. Registration for these events may be required.

To date, over 40,000 traps have been removed coastwide with the help of about 4,000 volunteers. This equates to 657,820 crabs saved since the beginning of the program in 2002. Upper Coast Capt. George Knighten Challenges, with rewards

February and March can be challenging, but these months can produce some of the largest trout of the year. That being said, it seldom comes easy so much to think about when its 70-degrees one day and high-30s the next.

That's the challenge. What's the water temperature? Are the tides super low? Will there be a moving tide? When is the best time to go? Moon phase, bait, water clarity, structure?

Successful fishermen can put all of this together. If I am targeting big fish, then I will be wading. I know Corkys are the lure many anglers throw this time of year but my personal favorite is the tried-and-true 51M Miro-lure. I will also try topwaters for a while no matter how cold it is.

Drifting is probably going to be your best bet for average-size fish. I like drifting over shell, especially if I see mullet. Many Galveston and Matagorda Bay fishermen fish off-colored streaks in the water. The bait uses it for cover to hide, predator fish use it to ambush, so I seldom pass up a dirty streak without giving it a try. If you see mullet in the streak, or it's over shell, your odds go up.

My go-to lure for drifting this time of year is the Bass Assassin or similar soft plastics. When fishing the streaks, I will occasionally use a Rattletrap. The vibration helps them find the lure in off colored water and the strikes can be aggressive. Weather: everything hinges on weather and that includes how you dress. Cold in the morning, hot later in the day and cold again for the ride back in. Dressing in layers that can come off and go back on easily is the way to go.

Conservation should be on all of our minds. The only way we will get our numbers back is with catch and release. I know it's hard to resist the temptation to show off a good catch back at the dock, but there is a special satisfaction with releasing a nice trout. Take a picture and let them go to reproduce. Hope your fishing trips are successful, stay safe and warm. — Capt. George Knighten 832-310-9146 <u>gtkphoto@yahoo.com</u>

Middle Coast Capt. Tommy Countz Go topwaters, live for the explosions

February: pay attention to the weather. I like to go a couple of days after a strong norther blows the tide down. For wading, I enjoy fishing West Matagorda Bay's south shoreline for redfish. When the tides are really low the redfish have to come out of the back areas. I concentrate my efforts on the drains coming out of the peninsula. My go-to baits are weedless gold spoons and paddle tail plastics rigged on 1/16 ounce leadheads. It's winter; the fish are cold and much less aggressive. Slow down your retrieve and "feel" the bite.

If I'm fishing from the boat, I'll be in East Matagorda Bay drifting the scattered shell on the west end or the big mud flats on the east end. If the water is cold, then the fish are also cold and much less aggressive. Slow down your retrieve and "feel" the bite. I like a heaver leadhead with a bright finfish imitation bait like a Norton Sand Shad Jr. in Margarita. Look for off-colored water and work your bait slooooow, keeping it just off the bottom.

March: Spring is in the air and hope springs eternal, so break out the topwaters and live for the explosions. My go-to topwater has been the Rapala pink Skitterwalk. If tops aren't producing, I'll go to a Norton Sandeel JR, rigged on a 1/16 ounce leadhead.

If you're a boat fisherman, your best bet is probably drifting East Matagorda Bay. Rig live shrimp under Mid-Coast corks with a three foot leader. If the water is clear I prefer tossing 1/4 ounce leadheads rigged with Norton Bull Minnows. My choice of colors is usually Black Magic or Margarita.

Be optimistic, but cautious. It's winter, and conditions change. Remember to check your waders for leaks; checking them after you get in the water can greatly increase the "shrivel factor." — Capt. Tommy Countz If you're interested in booking a trip you can call or text me at 281-450-4037.

Lower Coast Capt. Rene Hinojosa Think slow, but go!

February on the lower Texas coast: icey, windy and clear one day, warm, still and sea-foggy the next. You can use your GPS for navigation but watch for waders. I could be among them.

I like to start the day with topwaters. Choose your favorite, but think slow... That heart-stopping blowup is worth a lot of casting. I like the Skitterwalks and Super Spooks. But don't ever not try your favorite topwater any time of the day.

No secret spots to reveal, just try to locate bait and expect to find gamefish on grassy flats. We've had success with the Norton lures. I have affection for the Sand Eel red and white paddle tails beneath an 8 oz jig head. Try the Kellywigglers; red and white, Punkin' Seed. You can work them as "suspended" baits in deeper water with practice, keeping the rod tip up. If you're seeking a trophy speckled trout, shallow grassy flats with mud and baitfish are the recipe. Of course, the old Johnson Sprite gold spoon can be a winner.

We'll be wading mostly through February and looking forward to those days just after a strong front moves through. But drifting on a mild wind can provide a big payday for reds. On light wind and balmy days, ease along shorelines looking for trophy redfish. Slow is an important part of your equipment in February and March, whether balmy or breezy.

March comes in strong with plenty of wind, but the fish don't care if you're uncomfortable. There's always clear water somewhere, and maybe very little competition for that perfect spot. On light wind and balmy days, ease along shorelines looking for trophy redfish.

February or March, you'll be prepared with gear for your crew and a sharp eye for weather problems. Help a fellow fisherman if one needs it, and the same for your catch: send the big spotted ladies back for further duty. —Capt. Rene Hinojosa Jr. 956-966-0719 <u>shallowcharters@gmail.com</u>

33rd Annual CCA State of Texas Anglers' Rodeo Early Bird Registration Deadline is FRIDAY, APRIL 29!

hen the CCA Texas STAR Tournament Committee met in early 2021, they had to do the unthinkable in reimagining thirty-one years of tournament precedent. Well, as we look forward to another hot summer of tournament action, volunteers on the committee have once again shown their ability to adapt and refine the tournament's structure.

After the changes that were made to the 2021 STAR Tournament due to Winter Storm Uri, many anglers fell in love with the new format. However, there was an even bigger group of anglers, including STAR staff, that longed for the action that came with updating the leaderboards just waiting to see if they had been bested by another angler. After much deliberation and head scratching, STAR volunteers and staff believe we have come up with a semi-hybrid of the two

formats that capture the best components of each, with another big twist in the mix.

Big Ugly and Drumfish, are just a couple of the names you may hear black drum referred to. Well, now regarding STAR Tournament anglers, the Big Ugly can also be called Big Prize! The 2022 tournament will, for the very first time, feature a Black Drum category in the Open Inshore Division. This new species is sure to produce some exciting competition in the Open Inshore Division! Drum will be required to measure within a 24-28" slot on the Check-It-Stik Elite Measuring System provided to weigh-stations by

STAR, and anglers must provide photographic evidence of this length. The 24-28" slot size was designed to serve two purposes primarily, to help reduce the harvest of Black Drum in the tournament and prevent anglers from inadvertently bringing an illegal fish to the weigh-station. Please see <u>www.startournament.org</u> for more details.

As part of getting back to the tried-and-true tournament format, STAR 2022 will be the return of Gafftop and Sheepshead for the Open Inshore, STAR Kids, and STAR Teen Divisions. For the STAR Kids and STAR Teens there's a little twist in the prizes. Instead of having one \$50,000 or \$25,000 scholarship for the winner and gift cards for the other four places in the category, STAR volunteers decided to spread the love around some. All youth anglers on the final leaderboard will now receive a scholarship. This should certainly make things fun to watch this summer and help get more kids, and future conservationists, on the water!

On top of spreading out the scholarship dollars for more youth anglers, STAR volunteers recognized our country's need for more and more skilled tradesmen in the marketplace. 


