# The Time to Improve the Sustainability of Our Texas Oyster Fishery is NOW

#### The Oyster – A Valuable Resource

ysters are resilient organisms and the reef systems they create through generational recruitment are the backbone of our bay systems. They serve as essential fish habitat, refuge, and food for over 300 aquatic species while also providing valuable ecosystem services such as water filtration, wave attenuation, erosion control, and shoreline protection.

The estimated value of oysters in the water is \$2,000-\$40,000 per acre, which includes benefits of increased

biodiversity and fish production, protected shorelines, and improved water quality4. Additional benefits of oyster reefs for recreational angling are estimated to be \$23,000 per acre<sup>3</sup>. In total, the value of oysters in the water is much greater than that generated from commercial harvest from degraded reefs, estimated at \$880 per acre4.

Simply put, Texas oyster reefs are a critical component of the natural landscape, providing vital services for our bay systems and coastline. The importance of oysters as the

backbone of our bay systems and as a valuable commercial fishery means management of this resource is paramount. Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) must manage oysters as a fishery and as a habitat, therein

lies the user conflicts that we often see in this fishery and the differences in values placed upon the fishery.


#### A Growing Problem

Public oyster reefs (wild reefs) in Texas and across the Gulf of Mexico are not what they used to be<sup>1,2,5,6</sup>. As resilient as they are, they are not immune to the compounding effects of storms, droughts, floods, and mechanical dredging.

Expanding on the latter, we have seen an increased strain

- on the Texas oyster fishery due to...
- A larger demand for oysters

To curb the strain on the resource






Oyster Boats working shallow reefs in Coastal Bend.

#### the <u>Texas Legislature</u> passed a law in 2005

which established an oyster license moratorium, meaning they will not issue any new licenses but can renew existing ones on an annual basis. The idea was to reduce the number of boats fishing on public oyster reefs. Unfortunately, that bill had a yearlong forward-looking implementation date and the oyster industry rushed to purchase additional licenses,

increasing the number from 350 to 760. Through some attrition the number of licenses has decreased to today's current number of 533.

Still, the demand for Texas oysters has continued to rise which has led to increased participation for available licenses. Even previously latent licenses that were renewed yearly began to be utilized to meet this demand, undermining TPWD's efforts to manage the fishery through traditional measures such as bag limit reductions and fishing days. So, as you might imagine, we've seen a rise in the monetary value of these licenses.

Currently, more boats are active in the fishery than the resource can support, causing the available harvest to be quickly exploited. As areas are heavily fished and the number of marketable oysters reaches threshold levels, TPWD has been required to close certain harvest areas. This sometimes has the unintended effect of concentrating large numbers of boats into smaller areas leading to quicker harvest, concern over adverse impacts to vertical relief and reef integrity, and increases in user conflicts (read more here).

To put this growing problem in perspective, during the 2021-2022 season, 448 of the 533 available licenses (83%) reported landings. Historically, licensed vessels that landed oysters used to be in the 350-vessel range. That's a significant increase that weighs heavily on the sustainability of our Texas oyster fishery.

## The Key - Achieving a Sustainable Level of Oyster Licenses

The oyster fishery is overcapitalized and TPWD needs help in getting the number of active licenses down to a sustainable level. The ultimate goal, as agreed upon by TPWD and the commercial industry,

is to get the number of licenses down to the 250-300 range. One way to do this is through the Oyster License Buyback program. This was established by <a href="House Bill 51 of the">House Bill 51 of the</a> 85th Legislature in 2017.

The buyback program is structured as a reverse bid process, meaning that license holders inform TPWD of the price for which they would surrender their license.

- From 2018 2022, TPWD held five rounds of oyster license buybacks. A total of 15 bids were received over those rounds, with bids ranging from \$4,450 to \$50,000.
- Only 3 licenses have been purchased to date, at an average price of \$7,150.
- During the most recent round of buybacks (early 2023), TPWD received 54 bids with an average bid price of \$99,519, the lowest bid price was \$35,000 while the highest bid price was \$500,000. 13 bids came in at \$50,000, while the street value of these licenses is somewhere in the \$20 \$30K range.

What does this all mean? The oyster industry is attempting to fleece the buyback fund and artificially inflate oyster license values. However, by TPWD's own admission, it has become clear that to attract more bidders, the price for licenses paid to active license holders needs to be increased. While buybacks are in this price-discovery phase, there are other management actions under development, but first, let's set the stage for the discussion.

#### The Public's Reefs Versus Sustainable Leases

There is a stark contrast in how public oyster reefs are treated in comparison to areas under location (leases). Unfortunately, history teaches us that commercial dredging of public reefs will always befall the tragedy of the commons. As detailed throughout the article, this has most recently played out here in the Lone Star State. Texas historical landings data shows that approximately 80%

of the oysters come from public reefs and the remaining 20% from the 2,300 acres in Galveston Bay that are under certificates of location. Those percentages should be further balanced

through an expanded lease program, as leases are vastly more sustainable than the pillage that occurs on public reefs. In short, leases are a better way.

#### A Conservation Victory for CCA Texas and Our Partners

In November 2021, CCA Texas, FlatsWorthy, and numerous conservation organizations took muchneeded action and <u>submitted</u> <u>a letter</u> to the Texas Parks

and Wildlife Commission (TPWC), addressing critical concerns with the continued decline of public oyster reefs. In the letter, we provided actionable solutions, clearly spelling out suggested management approaches, such as oyster sanctuaries, to prioritize the structural and ecological value of oyster reefs and requested that TPWC provide opportunities to create more reef systems through a structured conservation/restoration lease program (restoration leases) and an expanded commercial lease program. The restoration leases would be off-limits for harvest and the commercial leases harvestable exclusively by the leaseholder.

The following November, in a major win for the conservation of our oyster fishery, the Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission (TPWC) adopted a proposal to permanently prohibit oyster harvest in Ayres, Mesquite, and Carlos Bays. These three bays are characterized by a diverse network of intertidal and deep oyster reefs, expansive seagrass beds, and fringing salt marsh, all of which provide critical nursery habitat for numerous aquatic species. In addition to the ecosystem services provided by these reefs, the positive role oyster reefs play in this habitat mosaic cannot be overstated and the proximity of Cedar Bayou to this area, serving as a migration and recruitment corridor, further justified the reason for this closure.

#### Moving Forward and Continuing Critical Conservation Work

Now, the work to expand commercial leases and establish restoration leases is underway. At the direction of TPWC Chairman Beaver Aplin, an oyster regulations workgroup consisting of 5 commercial seats, 4 conservation and environmental seats, and 1 academic seat, is working with TPWD on the framework for these programs. Additionally, a bill moving through the legislative process aims to further facilitate the leasing process. Sponsored by Senator Lois Kolkhorst (R-SD 18) and Representative Todd Hunter (R-HD 32), Senate Bill 1032 and House Bill 2475 clarify the definition of a "natural oyster bed" and clearly give TPWD authority to expand oyster leasing opportunities for both harvestable commercial operations and non-harvestable restoration

activities. The passage of this bill would be an immense win for our bay systems, guaranteeing more oysters in the water and more opportunities to invest in the health of our bays.

Oyster license buyback and leases aren't the only steps that need to be taken to

improve the sustainability of this fishery. There certainly are additional options available such as promoting the increased transition to cultivated oyster mariculture, improvement of oyster restoration strategies, establishing additional spawning sanctuaries, bay-specific harvest quotas, and even traditional measures such as gear restrictions, sack limits, and fishing days/season.

One thing is certain, while we put in a great deal of work to get to this point, we will continue to take steps towards improving the health and sustainability of our Texas oyster fishery here and now.

# Abandoned Crab Trap Removal Program 2023 Below is a breakout of traps retrieved by bay system, number

Below is a breakout of traps retrieved by bay system, number of participating boats and volunteers. The total number of traps retrieved since closed seasons commenced 21 years ago is 42,726. It is closer to 45,000 if you add in the traps CCA volunteers retrieved with Wardens on our boats to start the program before enactment of closed seasons. That equates to approximately 700,000 blue crabs saved.

Among the positive results from this 21-year old program is that most of the traps being retrieved are on the bank and out of the water. Also, commercial crabbers are doing a much better job of pulling their traps before the closed season starts.

#### Mid-Coast Bay Systems Abandoned CrabTrap Report

To all who were able to participate in the February 2023 cleanup, thank you again for your efforts to pick up the traps and collect the data!

This flyer was mailed to commercial crabbers in the Seadrift area. In total, 977 traps were removed from the three Mid-Coast bay systems. The flyer focuses on the San Antonio Bay system and waters immediately adjacent—so the numbers are different.

The best measure of progress toward reducing dereliction is the number of traps removed from open water (that could and should have been picked up by the crabber). The good news is that the number of traps removed from the open bay continues to decline!

Abandoned traps on shorelines due to windstorms or in the shallow marsh are more complicated to address, but there are measures we will be pursuing. Detailed reports are being compiled, and will be posted ASAP.



## Caught Redhanded!

#### Reports from Texas Parks & Wildlife Game Wardens

Here are a pair of great cases that show the enforcement challenges Texas Game Wardens face in the Texas bays and Gulf of Mexico waters. —Ronnie Luster

On 2/12/23 Matagorda County Game Wardens uncovered numerous fishery violations while conducting an inspection of a commercial gulf shrimping vessel inbound through West Matagorda Bay. Wardens uncovered the violations after moving numerous sacks of frozen shrimp and other aquatic products, spread out through three separate bins in the below deck freezer hold. Numerous charges pending after uncovering 31 red snapper (24 of which were undersized), 9 flounder over limit, 5 oversized red drum, 2 undersized grey triggerfish, and 5 bags of head and tailed game fish.

Also on 2/12/23 while conducting an inspection of a sport fishing vessel, it was found that three individuals were in possession of 13 Sheepshead over their daily bag limit (2 of which were able to be released back to the water). Charges pending.

# Putting fingerlings back where fish need to be





#### **Upper Coast**

## Fish shallow or deep with Team MacNaughton

As April temps warm up, marshes will begin their annual hosting of red fish and flounder. Artificials will be challenging as bait will be more plentiful as the spring hatch begins to fill the inshore fisheries. San Luis flats is a favorite this time of the year as well as the south shorelines at Christmas Bay and Drum Bay, particularly on the higher tides. If you are having trouble cracking that artificial code, nothing beats a popping cork and large, live shrimp.

The Spook Junior in clown remains my go to top water with a pink Skitter Walk or She Dog a close second. Soft plastics, smaller profile, matching the hatch. I prefer an 1/8 oz jig head on calmer days, increasing weight with winds and current to fit your retrieval. You will want to speed up your retrieval as fish fall into those spring patterns, feeding more aggressively.

Now comes June. Birds are always great indicators of bait and gamefish. Greens and Carancahua will be local favorites this time of the year. Hitting marsh drains and back pockets, using a lighter jighead with a slower approach is a solid tactic to finesse that flounder bite.

GO SHALLOW! Catching falling tides in a kayak can provide an adventure all on its own. I like to set up just outside of marsh drains during the fall of the tide. If you don't have a kayak, consider jetty and pier action, now heating up as the warmer weather brings plentiful bait along the gulf shore lines.

Jigging jetty rocks and piers brings quick luck and nice size pup drums, sheepshead and croaker. Bait of choice for me when I am not tossing plastic, is free lining shrimp or bits of dead shrimp under a cork. A rattle trap or spoon is a great clutch bait to have in your artificial arsenal.

Each time we introduce the outdoors to the next generation, we preserve the sport we love just a little bit more. Till next time, catch me on the tide swing!

#### **Middle Coast**

#### Cover every pothole and dropoff

Spring has sprung and this season should be top notch for reds and trout. A mild dry winter and return of bull tides will make for a great spring bite.

Popping corks of almost any size can be one of your go to's for early spring, baited with live shrimp or Gulp soft plastics. Use a 2 to 4 foot fluorocarbon leader in 20 to 40 lb test using a 1/16 oz jighead, due to the likely hookups of larger trout and reds. Use a variety of retrieve speeds and different frequency of "pops" to see how they're biting.

Soft plastics in white, white and chartreuse, red with white tails and pink work well in the spring, because they imitate the new abundance of shrimp just in from the Gulf.

Of course, give your favorite topwaters a shot, especially early in the day. I like the bone and black, but the old fashioned red and white works across the flats. Cover every pothole and drop-off, worked at a speedy, noisy retrieve.

For that monster trout confrontation, try Corkies in white and chartreuse, purple or pink. Send the big spotted ladies back, of course.

Starting now, the jetties will produce great bites on light wind days. Into May, the back bays will be your best bet fishing in one or two feet working the windward side of any island or bank.

Remember to be considerate of other fishermen, protect the resource and stay safe. Good luck and tight lines.

#### **Lower Coast**

Capt. Rene Hinojosa Explosion at dawn

For much of the Texas coast, wind is a problem. In our Laguna Madre region, wind is your friend. Currents move along with bait, your boat and your choice of gamefish. April means shrimp are coming in from the Gulf in large numbers, so rig accordingly. We've had success with the Norton array of lures. I have affection for the Sand Eel Red and white paddle tails beneath an 8-oz jig head. Try the Kellywigglers; strawberry and white, bull minnow on Norton Lazerheads. Never NOT try a topwater, especially early in the morning. I like the Super Spook white and silver and Bozo the Clown. An explosion at dawn is a great way to start the day.

As May begins, plan for bull tides and try areas usually too shallow. They'll be holding bait and gamefish. Those open areas will be the choice for bedding areas and spawning mommas. No winter freeze damage again for the lower coast, so we can expect the good news about speckled trout to continue. The three-fish limit seems to be a big factor in the recovery of our sea trout resource. I think we should keep it that way but wonder if two tags per year for keeping trophy trout would be a reward for all the days of our care and conservation. Just sayin'.

Care for your catch and your crew and leave it better than you found it. Maybe you'll join the Bassler Cleanup Crew for the June 9th Cut and Beach Cleanup.

## Shrimp stuffed mushrooms

1/4 cup EVOO / 1/3 cup finely chopped onion / 1/4 cup finely chopped fresh basil / 1/2 tsp finely chopped rosemary / 3 cloves garlic, diced / 6 oz. fresh shrimp, diced / 2/3 cup bread crumbs / 1/3 cup parmesan cheese / 1/4 cup mayo / 8 baby bella mushrooms, stems and gills removed / salt and pepper to taste.

Saute onion, basil and rosemary in EVOO till onions are transparent. Add garlic, cook for 2 min. Add shrimp, cook till pink. Transfer to a medium bowl, add bread crumbs, parmesan and mayo. Mix well and season to taste with salt and pepper.

Place mushrooms round side down on a parchment lined pan. Fill the mushrooms, pressing tightly and slightly mounded. Sprinkle with breadcrumbs. Bake at 350 for 35 minutes.
