Management with a Vision

Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission approves proposal to modify the bag limit and slot size for Spotted Seatrout.

"You either live in vision or you live in circumstance." – Dr. Kevin Elko

This philosophy is applicable to most aspects of our lives, from career aspirations and homeownership to retirement plans and children's college savings. The core foundation of the Coastal Conservation Association (CCA) is rooted in this forward-thinking mindset, explicitly outlined in our mission to conserve, promote, and enhance coastal resources for the benefit of the public for present and future generations.

Fortunately, that vision remains alive and well today, and generations to come will benefit from recent actions taken to conserve and enhance the Spotted Seatrout fishery.

On January 25, 2024, the Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission (TPWC) approved alterations to

Spotted Seatrout regulations. The adjustments include reducing the daily bag limit from 5 to 3 fish, tightening the slot limit from 15-25 inches to 15-20 inches, and modifying the threshold for an oversized fish from 25 to 30 inches. While the implementation date is pending, the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) anticipates the rule to be in effect by the end of March. <u>Click here to watch the meeting</u>.

TPWD projects a potential 27% increase in spawning stock biomass over a generation of Spotted Seatrout (seven years) as a result of these changes. The department expects

> the benefits to amplify with time, barring external factors affecting juvenile recruitment or adult mortality.

The TPWD received 2.851 comments on the proposed changes, with 36% fully supporting, 38% supporting and objecting to certain aspects, and 25% entirely opposed. Within the 38% group, diverse opinions emerged, ranging from preferences for different slot sizes to objections against the bag limit reduction. However, a significant portion of the comment submissions recognized a need to do something rather than nothing. Common themes within this diverse group also included a desire to retain one fish over 20 inches, support for an oversize tag, no retention of an oversized fish, concerns about excessive daily oversize catches, and worries about the proposal targeting female trout and productive breeders.

While opinions on fishery management vary, a majority of public comments favored some form of regulation change to conserve and enhance the fishery. Prior to the TPWC meeting, the <u>CCA Texas Executive Board voted to</u> support the <u>TPWD proposal</u>. Additionally, CCA Texas

recommended no allowance for retaining oversized fish until a tag system for fish 25 inches or greater is implemented. This recommendation was communicated, written and verbally, at the January 25th TPWC meeting.

Looking ahead, TPWD plans to publish a new proposal soliciting public comment on developing a tag system for oversized Spotted Seatrout. This proposal will be considered for adoption at the TPWC meeting on March 28, 2024. If approved, the tag system, replacing the daily oversize fish allowance, is expected to be implemented in the next license year starting September 1st. Public input will play a crucial role in determining the preferred length for the tag system.

It also underscores the meaningful impact of grassroots engagement and your continuous participation in fisheries management.

Rocky Chase, Chairman of the CCA Texas Government Affairs Committee, aptly summarized the Parks and Wildlife Commission's decision by stating, "This decision by the Parks and Wildlife Commission displays management with a vision for the future, and the next generation of anglers owe them a debt of gratitude for their actions."

SPECIES PROFILES SPOTTED SEATROUT

Spotted seatrout (Cynoscion nebulosus), known as speckled trout, is a popular game fish targeted by anglers along the Texas coast. This species is a member of the drum family (Sciaenidae) and is closely related to red drum, black drum, sand seatrout, and Atlantic croaker. Distinguishing characteristics include a dark gray or green back and silvery-white below, with distinct black spots on its back, fins, and tail. The inside of their mouth is yellow; typically, they have one or two prominent canine teeth at the tip of their upper jaw.



Reproduction: Spotted seatrout reach sexual maturity as early as age one. Spawning takes place from April through September when water temperatures range from 70°-90° F. Females can spawn multiple batches

per season (9 batches per season assumed in the table below), and the number of eggs produced is dependent upon their size. Small fish are capable of releasing over 100,000 eggs, and larger females can release over 1 million eggs, per spawning event. Two-, three-, and four-year-old fish make up the bulk of the spawning population. When spawning commences, males will surround females, bumping or nudging the stomachs of females to induce them to release eggs. Once eggs are released, males will release their milt (sperm) which fertilizes the eggs. Fertilized eggs hatch in 20 to 24 hours. Research indicates that spotted seatrout spawn between dusk and dawn and broadcast spawn within coastal bays, estuaries, and lagoons. Peak spawning takes place around new and full moon periods when large tidal swings carry their buoyant eggs and larvae into shallow seagrass beds, which provide critical nursery habitat offering cover from predators and abundant food resources.

Habitat: Spotted seatrout reside in shallow bays and estuaries near marsh edge, seagrass beds, oyster reefs, or rock formations that attract prey items.

Salinity: Spotted seatrout are euryhaline, meaning they can tolerate a wide range of salinity, and have been found in salinities ranging from 0.2 ppt – 75 ppt.

Temperature: Spotted seatrout can live in a broad range of temperatures. They can tolerate water temperatures from 39 - 91° F if they are acclimated gradually to the extreme of these ranges. Along the

Texas Gulf Coast, sudden and extreme temperature decreases accompanying cold fronts often result in mass mortalities of spotted seatrout. The rate of temperature change and acclimation period may be more important than how low the temperature drops. Thermal stress mortality occurs when they are exposed to water temperatures lower than 45° F for over 24 hours. However, fish exposed to temperatures between 45–50° F for short periods can recover and survive.



Growth: Spotted seatrout growth rates are different for males and females. Females grow faster and larger versus males in the same age class. Studies also reveal there is a high degree of variability that exists in spotted seatrout growth rates in bays along the Texas Coast. They can live

to be 9 to 10 years of age and can reach lengths of more than 30 inches. Although rare, the oldest documented spotted seatrout in Texas was a 12-year-old, 25 inch male.

CCA Texas Funds \$246,204 for Habitat Restoration

CA Texas recently approved \$246,000 for two habitat restoration projects along the Texas coast. \$46,204 was funded for Phase I engineering for the **Ayers Point Reef Restoration Project on the eastern end of Ayers reef.**

These funds will emanate from the \$5 million CCA Texas Oyster Restoration Initiative. They will be combined with funds from other organizations, like the Coastal Bend Bays and Estuaries Program (CBBEP), which they have received to execute the phase one engineering portion of this project

CBBEP and the Mission-Aransas National Estuarine Research Reserve system (NERR) have also jointly applied for a NOAA NERRS Habitat Protection This will be the first project and the top priority area as identified by members of the Mesquite Bay Complex Oyster Restoration Initiative.

and Restoration Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) Competition grant for future construction.

This will be the first project and the top priority area as identified by members of the Mesquite Bay Complex Oyster Restoration Initiative.

CCA Texas and the Galveston Bay Foundation (GBF) have been long-time partners in several projects. The **Oyster Lake Shoreline Protection Project** is in Phase III of construction and CCA Texas has funded \$200,000 to help

extend the shoreline protection by an additional 300 plus feet.

The funds will be allocated from the grassroots fundraising efforts of local chapters for the Building Conservation Trust (BCT) Texas habitat

fund. CCA Texas has now funded \$430,000 to the restoration efforts to protect the sensitive Oyster Lake estuarine system, located at the very west end of West Galveston Bay.

CCA Texas looks forward to the lasting, positive impact these conservation efforts will bring and the continued critical partnerships that will help restore Texas's coastal habitat.

Caught Redhanded! Reports from Texas Parks & Wildlife Game Wardens

Several recent cases deserve special mention as examples of the wide range of service Texas Game Wardens provide. -Ronnie Luster, CCA Liason with Texas Parks & Wildlife Game Wardens

On December 5, 2023, Matagorda County Game Wardens filed on a commercial gulf shrimp boat for possessing (72) flounder in closed season and (2) Turtle Excluder Device violations. Cases Pending.

On January 16, 2024, Region 4 Wardens patrolled the Upper Coast during the cold weather event to assist Coastal Fisheries with sea turtles stunned by the low temperatures. Many stunned turtles were rescued by Wardens and transported to biologists for rehabilitation.

On January 30, 2024, a Matagorda County Warden filed on two people for possessing nine undersized black drum. Cases pending.

Finicky fish need persuasion February will be cold and slow, but slow sinking lures and a methodical wade along a leeward shoreline can be the ticket to a yellow mouthed speckled trout with much girth and color. Look for signs of bait. A few mullet in an area can indicate good water. Wading broken shell with a bit of a soft bottom near ditches and drains can produce some favorable outings.

On days having lighter winds, long boat drifts using soft plastics can be effective. Finicky fish will tell you how they want a meal presented.

Moving into March, live bait under a popping cork can be a good option when targeting speckled trout and redfish. A popping cork attached to a 3-to-4-foot 20lb test mono leader with a small slit shot and #2 kahle is a popular rig.

As the tides begin to push water and bait into the bay, shallow areas with shell and rock formations can be prime locations to target, especially when there are signs of bait fish or fish slicks.

The STAR Tournament is quickly approaching. Get everyone signed up. As always, use good judgment and be courteous to your fellow fishermen both at the launch and on the water. Middle Coast Fish shallow or deep with Team MacNaughton

For kayak fishing enthusiasts Congratulations! The Aransas Pathways, kayak launches and amenities are at your fingertips. Maps are available free by visiting www.aransaspathways.com

Whether trolling along the shallows, targeting the mangrove shorelines, or venturing further into the bay's expansive waters, anglers can expect a diverse range of encounters that will leave them in awe of the area's natural wonders. With the spring transition, targeting points coming into the marsh and mangroves, finding the drains that lead out will set you up for a successful day. A lightweight jig head, with a good swim plastic will get the job done. If you find yourself in darker waters, the roach is always a good back up. I have found success using the Texas Rattler jig heads.

Cruising shorelines is an easy process. Target those areas closer to mouths and openings into the back waters. Spring time feeders cruise and ambush at those points.

Staying informed about wind patterns, tidal phases, and any potential weather fluctuations is crucial for ensuring a safe and enjoyable kayak fishing experience. Be sure you have a float plan in place and a good strategy if the weather turns. I recommend paddling with a friend for safety. As an added measure ALWAYS wear your life jacket.You don't need it, until you need it. -Jenn McNaughton

Go deep or wade?

As the waters warm up, trout and redfish will be plentiful in the mid-bay reefs and marsh drains in Aransas Bay and Saint Charles Bay. As spring takes over, I suggest using Texas Rattler Jigs paired with Down South Lures. I have had great success with an assortment of color choices: Texas Roach, Plum, and Big Pappa Pearl, in Supermodel have caught fish. Corky, fat boys and topwaters are staples for your tackle box and should produce good fish.

Lower Aransas bay will now be producing good trout in 3-4 feet of water, but find grass! I suggest using Texas Rattler jigs with Chicken On A Chain paddle tails in these environments. The specialty rattle in the jig and the live look of the eye, really brings on a strike.

I hope this forecast of what to expect as spring arrives brings you bountiful catches and beautiful memories. Don't forget to wear your life jacket and if you get the chance, TAKE A KID FISHING!

Lower Coast Capt. Reanna DeLaCruz

The thrill of the season! Some of the most challenging and rewarding fishing occurs during the winter and into early spring here in The Lower Coast. The cool water temperatures, low water levels and continuous cold fronts will keep the activity amongst our game fish consistent.

As late winter forms into early spring, baitfish activity will increase, bringing the shrimp that have migrated in late fall back into our estuaries. Redfish, speckled trout and flounder will find cover in shallow grass beds, dropoffs and guts to attack their prey. Fishing these types of structure with positive signs of baitfish is crucial. Swirls, slicks, small baitfish jumping and pelicans are all important signs to look for when deciding where to fish during late winter to early spring.

Lures of choice depend on the water clarity. The rule is, dark hues for darker water and light hues for clearer water. Here in the Lower Coast, we throw a lot of Custom Corky's, MirrOlure Little John's with a 1/32oz hook as well as suspending twitch baits. The most important factor when deciding what lure to throw is making sure you have confidence in it. Confidence is key when looking to catch the fish of a lifetime!

Keep an eye out to help another boater in need. It could be you another time. Remember to keep what you need and release the rest. As always tight lines! -Capt. Reanna DeLaCruz Ba in Bay Adventures / 512-962-6041

Mahi Mahi Creamy Chowder

2 cloves garlic, finely chopped / 1 branch celery, finely chopped / 2 tablespoons salted butter / 2 tablespoons flour / 2 cups milk / 2 cups heavy whipping cream / ½ teaspoon salt / ¼ teaspoon pepper / ¼ teaspoon Old Bay Seasoning / ¼ teaspoon ground thyme / 1 ½ lb pan seared Mahi Mahi cut into small cubes

Prepare the Mahi by seasoning it with salt, pepper and Old Bay Seasoning generously on both sides. Pan fry on med high heat in butter and olive oil, turning only once, when browned. Remove from pan and set aside.

In a 5 quart dutch oven, melt butter over medium heat. Add onion and celery. Saute for 2-3 minutes, adding garlic the last minute. Add flour, mixing with the vegetables, then, slowly add milk and cream, stirring constantly. Add salt, pepper, Old Bay seasoning and thyme, continuing to stir till simmering. Reduce heat and continue to simmer for 15 to 20 minutes, stirring occasionally. Taste and adjust seasoning as needed. Allow soup to cool a bit. Gently fold in the Mahi Mahi. Heat through and serve warm.
