CCA Texas Habitat Efforts Continue to Move Forward

T ts's hard to believe but when this issue arrives, we'll be through six months of 2024. 2024. CCA Texas is once again off to a strong start due to the great efforts of the local chapter volunteers, sponsors and supporters. The CCA Texas staff looks forward to hosting the local chapter volunteers in Rockport for the annual Inter-Chapter Challenge in June. CCA Texas and its partners continue to move

CCA Texas has now funded over \$10.3 million in habitat efforts and has committed another \$5 million to oyster reef restoration and creation efforts along the Texas coast in areas closed to harvest.

Oyster Habitat Restoration

CCA Texas, its partners and others are working to identify areas for restoration and creation up and down the Texas coast. Two that are currently being looked at are the Mesquite Bay complex and Caranchua Bay. Working closely with the

Working closely with the Coastal Bend Bays and Estuaries Program (CBBEP), Harte Research Institute (HRI), the University of Texas Marine Science Institute (UTMSI), FlatsWorthy and others, areas are being identified and prioritized for restoration in the Mesquite Bay Complex.

The number one priority at this time is the Northeastern end of Ayers Reef. Although currently in design, this effort will be similar in construction to the St. Charles Bay Big Tree Unit restoration project, featuring a segmented reefing complex that allows for water flow through the reefs and protection of the existing shorelines. The early phases of engineering are in progress and will identify any necessary design changes and estimated costs. This area was identified as critical to protect an eroding shoreline that would eventually create a large breach between Matagorda Island and Ayers Reef if not protected.

The Matagorda Bay Foundation, local community residents and other organizations are looking at areas of restoration in Caranchua Bay. The Bay was closed to all harvest of oysters in





2017 after an intense commercial harvest in the years prior. Matagorda Bay Foundation has contracted with an engineering firm for the early stages of surveying to identify suitable areas for restoration and creation efforts. The longterm goal is to permit an area and begin the restoration process with a heavy community involvement much like the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department's (TPWD) Nearshore Reefing Program. Surveys should begin as this issue is released and CCA Texas looks forward to being a part of this future restoration effort.

Nearshore Reefing

CCA Texas has contributed over \$3.6 million in nearshore reefing efforts from Sabine Pass to South Padre Island. The Friends of RGV Reef continue to create nearshore reefing habitat on a scale never seen before. Currently there are over 14,000 tons of reefing materials and two cleaned and prepared vessels waiting on the permit renewal from U.S. Army Corps of Engineers for deployment. This permit is expected this summer, so it is with great hope that deployments will begin once again in the summer of 2024. The grassroots efforts by Friends of RGV Reef have been incredibly successful and set the basis for other similar efforts. Friends of RGV Reef are to be commended and the recreational fishing community of South Texas and those that visit thank you.

Sabine Pass Nearshore reefs are moving into the next phase of habitat creation. The new HI-54 Shallow Reef permit is now in place. Efforts to secure





materials of opportunity for reefing are ongoing alongside discussions on pricing and possible timetables with contractors. There are high hopes of deployments starting in late June or early July. This new site is unique given its location just off the beach of Sea Rim State Park. Located 1.9 miles off the beach, this site will give recreational anglers easy access, including kayakers off the beachfront. Friends of Sabine Reefs have done a fantastic job securing the help of local industry partners. These partners include Cheniere, Port Arthur LNG (Sempra), Motiva, Golden Pass LNG, Valero, and Dow Chemical Sabine Ops. These partners have supported the efforts of Friends of Sabine Reefs from day one. This type of support is the necessary support to make these types of efforts possible.

CCA Texas is excited to see the many habitat restoration and creation projects continue to progress and looks forward to being part of them all.

CCA Texas Advocacy Update

Some developments are unfolding on various items that have strong potential to influence fisheries and habitat, some at a snail's pace and others seemingly moving at lightspeed. CCA Texas remains vigilant, actively monitoring crucial matters impacting the sustainability of our coastal resources. We would like to take this opportunity to spotlight some key issues currently on our radar.

LNRA WATER USE PERMIT – WRPERM 13728

The Lavaca-Navidad River Authority (LNRA) has applied for and received a draft permit to divert 30 billion gallons of water annually from a designated reach on the Lavaca River for industrial, municipal, and mining purposes

across several counties within the Lavaca River Basin, as well as the Colorado-Lavaca and Lavaca-Guadalupe Coastal Basins. The permit would enable the LNRA to construct and maintain a dam and reservoir impounding 240 acre-feet of water on the Lavaca River and grant authorization for the use of the bed and banks of the Navidad River (Lake Texana) to convey the diverted

water and/or store it in a proposed 16 billion gallon offchannel reservoir. CCA Texas has requested that the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) provide the public with a comprehensive overview of the permit by holding a public meeting. This meeting will be instrumental in presenting detailed insights into the environmental and ecological impacts expected from the proposed activities.

In addition to the request for a public meeting, CCA Texas has filed a contested case hearing request on this permit to address grave concerns that the LNRA and TCEQ have not identified and adequately addressed the full scope of the proposed appropriation and draft permit. Concerns include but aren't limited to the amounts, timing and diversion point or points of the proposed appropriation, the diversion dam and the offchannel reservoir, amount of freshwater inflows to

Lavaca Bay, changes to the freshwater/saltwater interface, and resulting impacts on fish, oysters and other aquatic species dependent upon the Lavaca River, Lavaca Bay and the associated coastal ecosystems.

In addition to the CCA Texas contested case hearing request, there were 62 hearing requests submitted





to the TCEQ, including requests from the National Wildlife Federation, Matagorda Bay Foundation, Lavaca River Ranch, Hilcorp, and San Antonio **Bay Estuarine** Waterkeeper. To date, this permit application has received 118 public meeting requests, including requests submitted by State Senators Kolkhorst and

Huffman, and State Representative Lozano. <u>Click on this link</u> if you would like to view all comments submitted to TCEQ on this permit.

MATAGORDA SHIP CHANNEL IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

The Calhoun Port Authority and Max-Midstream have been pursuing a project to address issues with the Matagorda Ship Channel. Constructed between 1962 and 1966, the Matagorda Ship Channel is an approximate 26-mile-long deep draft channel from the Gulf of Mexico

to Port Lavaca. This project will address the channel's insufficient width and depth, which limits vessel size and increases the potential for pilot error during times of high winds, waves, and shoaling. (Shoaling occurs when the channel naturally becomes increasingly shallow through the build-up of sediment.)

In addition, the width of the existing turning basin also limits vessel size. The objectives of the Matagorda Ship Channel Improvement Project are to: Increase port efficiencies and reduce transportation costs; utilize dredged material beneficially to protect and/or restore significant ecological and historical resources; and reduce risks to life safety and local infrastructure. This will be accomplished by extending, deepening, and widening the channel to varying depths and widths.

<u>CCA Texas has issued a statement on this project</u> and is advocating for the wise use of dredge material for beneficial projects within Matagorda Bay to enhance fisheries, habitat, and coastal resiliency. Should the MSCIP move forward, dredge material should be used to provide ecosystem benefits on a landscape scale in Matagorda Bay. The USACE should utilize a suite of environmental restoration and creation features including in-bay marshes, beach nourishment, shoreline protection, oyster reef creation, and nesting shorebird habitat that will offset the negative impacts of this project.



CEDAR PORT NAVIGATION AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT CHANNEL DEEPENING PROJECT

This project aims to assess the viability and federal interest in establishing a deep-water link between the Houston Ship Channel and a potential forthcoming deepwater terminal at Cedar Port Industrial Park. This initiative seeks to enhance navigation safety and efficiency in both the Cedar Bayou Navigation Channel and the Houston Ship Channel. The envisioned Cedar Port terminal offers an alternative

facility to handle projected cargo volumes, mitigating congestion in the upper Houston Ship Channel and averting delays in cargo operations. As the non-federal sponsors under authority granted by section 203 of Water Resources Development Act 2022, Cedar Port Navigation and Improvement District is preparing an integrated feasibility study and environmental impact statement (EIS) for the Cedar Port Navigation District Channel Deepening Project.

During the scoping process for the development of this EIS, CCA Texas submitted comments expressing significant concerns for dredging impacts on fisheries and habitat, and if the project were to move forward, advocated for dredge material to be located within confined placement areas. <u>Click here</u> to view a map with proposed alternatives. Rest assured, CCA Texas will keep a watchful eye on this project and inform our members of opportunities to speak up for coastal resources.

PORT MANSFIELD CONTAINER PORT

The 2024-2025 TxDOT Maritime Division Texas Port Mission Plan outlines various projects aimed at enhancing global trade opportunities. With a total value of \$9.67 billion, these projects include \$4.34 billion for inland connectivity needs, \$1.67 billion for port infrastructure investments, and \$3.66 billion for federally authorized ship channel improvements. Of particular concern to anglers and residents of Port Mansfield is a proposal

to repair a bulkhead near a 6-acre quelling yard to accommodate container vessels, potentially altering the tranquil nature of the port. The plan also envisions extending the airport by 1,200 feet to accommodate cargo aircraft and designating SH 186 and FM 1420 as heavy haul routes to support oversize/overweight loads. CCA Texas is closely monitoring these proposed initiatives and will engage with regulatory authorities once permit notices become available.

GULF COUNCIL JUNE MEETING

The <u>Gulf of Mexico Fisheries Management Council</u> (Gulf Council) is scheduled to meet in Houston Texas, June 24-27, 2024 at the <u>Omni Houston Hotel</u>. CCA Texas is encouraging members to attend the event, particularly on Wednesday, June 26th, to provide public comment to the Gulf Council. Be on the lookout for an email with more details as we get a little closer to the meeting dates.

OYSTER ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) will soon announce the committee members for the Oyster Advisory Committee (OAC), which will serve as an advisory board to the Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission. Some future discussions will include



the development of conservation leases, expansion of commercial leases, and regulatory tools to ensure longterm sustainability of public oyster reefs. The OAC will be comprised of no more than 24 individuals with representation from a broad group of stakeholders. CCA Texas will have representation on this committee and will continue to advocate for the conservation of public oyster reefs.

CITY OF CORPUS CHRISTI DESALINATION PLANT – INNER HARBOR

Per notice of application and preliminary decision for TPDES Permit Number WQ0005289000, the City of Corpus Christi proposes to operate a desalination facility in the City of Corpus Christi Inner Harbor at the intersection of Nueces Bay Boulevard and East Broadway Street, with a discharge effluent in the Corpus Christi Channel, located within the Corpus Christi Bay ecosystem. CCA Texas opposes TPDES Permit No. WQ0005289000. CCA Texas recognizes that sound desalination technology is crucial in securing dependable freshwater sources for Texas but accepted marine science mandates that the intake and discharge points be located offshore to minimize impacts to the estuary. For any operation to be considered, we offer the following recommendations:

• Intake and Discharge points should be located in offshore waters to minimize the impacts on fragile ecosystems.

• If possible, intake piping for any desalination plant should be installed below the seabed via directional drilling.

• Site-specific studies of conditions at proposed locations should be conducted to identify environmental impact and risks to the ecosystem.

Implementing an offshore intake and discharge for a desalination plant offers several advantages, minimizing direct impacts on the ecosystem by avoiding the disruption of sensitive habitats and species within the estuary. Offshore intake also allows for the extraction of seawater from deeper and cleaner waters, and discharging the brine offshore disperses it in a larger volume of seawater, diluting its concentration and mitigating its impact on marine life and water quality in coastal areas. In summary, opting for offshore intake and discharge for desalination plants provides a more ecologically sound solution while still feasibly addressing freshwater needs in Texas.

TAKING ACTION

As industrial development opportunities expand regionally and our state's population continues to surge, CCA Texas members must remain vigilant to ensure the conservation of fishery resources and maintain access for anglers. Conservation and economic development can progress together, and our advocacy need not be a zero-sum game. Caught Redhanded!

Reports from Texas Parks & Wildlife Game Wardens

While working an NRDA patrol recently out of the Port Aransas jetties, wardens checked a recreational boat coming from federal waters into state waters and located twelve illegally imported red snapper. Citations to multiple fishermen issued.

On May 15 while performing Turtle Excluder Device compliance inspections on commercial gulf shrimp boats, Texas Game Wardens assigned to Calhoun and Victoria Counties were working near the Port O' Connor. At this time, they observed a gulf shrimp boat entering Matagorda Bay through the Port O'Connor jetties. The Gulf boat was traveling to the Port of Palacios after returning from shrimping in Louisiana waters. During their boarding, the wardens inspected the freezer hold of the boat, where it was discovered to hold several bags of flounder and one cobia. The wardens determined that the crew possessed over their limit of flounder and that the cobia had been illegally caught. Citations and civil restitution are pending.

March 2nd while on NRDA patrol, wardens encountered a vessel coming into Texas waters illegally importing snapper. Cases filed and resources seized.

Wildlife Resources were donated to those in need.

Slot redfish, game-on experience Brutal flooding in May, but the bay will soon regain its salt levels and fish will again be tugging on lines.With a light breeze and minimal chop on the water, anglers should look for and target feeding fish that can be detected by small "slicks" and "sweet watermelon" smells. Early morning wades in areas having shell and sand can also be an excellent choice. Anglers should identify areas holding pods of mullet or other bait sources.

It just doesn't get any better than chunking that topwater lure in the low light. Work the lure in various ways; I personally like the small twitch and sit method. Either way can entice a toothy trout or bruiser slot redfish for a game- on experience.

As always, working areas of rocks for reds, sheepshead and black drum can be a popular method, especially if you have youngsters aboard. If fishing along or near the shipping lanes, be mindful of ship waves. Don't forget that you can enter the STAR Tournament anytime, but now is better.

Finally, with the heat, stay hydrated. Utilize good judgment and be courteous to your fellow fishermen both at the launch and on the water. Middle Coast

Tailing reds in both months Wahoo! Sweet corn in June, ripe melons in July and tailing reds in both months. Whatever spring brought you as fishing challenges, be it wind or unusual low water levels, they should now be less problematic. I key on two things—water level and wind direction. Calculating the daily tide becomes more effective in choosing a location.

July is either hot, dry and boring or a holy terror. The daily slow loss of water creates a feature-less system to work with. No current - no fish! Afternoons become opportunities for other coastal activities.

I never have been a huge summertime trout fisherman. I save that for the fall and winter. Redfish on the flats, under birds, and spartina grass shorelines were my "hot month" targets. I learned many years ago to land a redfish quickly before it was exhausted as releasing a red in 90-degree water is certain death.

With more people on the water and more of the anglers skilled in their efforts, catch and release is essential for the future of our fishery. That trite old phrase of releasing to freezer-burn rings true. Cook what you catch before vacuum packing.

I see videos of fish cleaning that are disturbing. The fact that you can clean one at warp-speed has nothing to do with how much edible fish you are discarding. The best part of a redfish is the throat and belly flaps great table fare. Boil and make into fish cakes or half shell the throat.

Lower Coast

Photos last longer than fillets As the south Texas heat settles in on the Lower Laguna Madre, Summertime fishing patterns begin to develop. We experienced unusually low tides this past Spring and now our temperatures are soaring. This pushed our fish into the

deeper waters quickly this season. When targeting speckled trout, I look for active bait over deep grass. Shrimp, pinfish and mullet have been abundant in these areas close to deep water access. Tidal flow and wind driven currents can help tremendously during these hotter months. Redfish have also been showing up with the trout out deep.

I'm catching most of my fish on small soft plastics danced over the grass and through the potholes. An LSU-colored Norton Sand Eel Jr. has been my go-to for years. This lure on a 1/8 oz jig head is highly effective. On days where we wade fish, a gold spoon works great for the redfish. We've also had great success throwing the Mansfield Knockers topwaters. The fish will crush this thing! However, with all the recent high winds, floating grass has limited the use of topwaters lately.

Now is the time to get the kids on the water. Been seeing quite a few already. Most schools are out for the Summer. Time to make some memories on the water. Take lots of pictures. Sauteed oysters with Ernie Sauce

Like a thousand other CCA members, the CURRENTS Editor looks forward to the San Antonio banquet each year. One reason is Don Strange's sauteed oysters. Here's the classic recipe—oyster shells optional.

Makes 24 half-shell servings

ᆔ

Drain 24 or so oysters, reserving ¹/₄ cup of the oyster liquid; pat oysters dry with absorbent paper towels and set aside. Prepare the *Ernie Sauce*. Melt the butter in a heavy-bottomed 3-quart saucepan over medium heat. When the butter is sizzling, add the flour all at once, stirring vigorously to blend. Cook, stirring constantly, for 3 to 4 minutes. Combine all remaining ingredients and add to the butter roux, whisking to incorporate. Bring the mixture to a boil to thicken, then reduce heat and cook for five minutes. Keep sauce warm while preparing oysters.

Dredge each oyster in the seasoned flour and shake off excess. Melt butter in a heavy bottomed 14-inch skillet over medium-high heat. Add the oysters. Cook, stirring gently, just until the oysters begin to curl at the edges, about 3 to 4 minutes. Take care not to overcook them. They should still be quite soft.

Arrange oyster shells on individual plates. Using a slotted spoon, place an oyster in each shell. Spoon some of the Ernie Sauce over each oyster or pass the sauce separately; serve at once.

INGREDIENTS

24 shucked oysters, shells scrubbed and reserved if desired. 4 cups all-purpose flour, seasoned with 2 tablespoons finely ground black pepper and 2 tablespoons kosher salt ¹/₂ pound (2 sticks) unsalted butter.

Ernie Sauce / ¼ pound (1 stick) unsalted butter / 3 tablespoons all-purpose flour ¼ cup freshly squeezed lemon juice / 2 tablespoons Worcestershire sauce / ½ cup A-1 Steak Sauce / ¼ cup reserved oyster liquid / ¼ cup dry white wine.
