Revitalizing Texas Bays: The Certificate of Location Program Offers a Win-Win for Conservation and Anglers

ealthy Texas coastal ecosystems are vital to coastal communities, providing not only critical habitat and ecological benefits recognized by conservationists, but also supporting the thriving recreational fisheries enjoyed by anglers throughout the state. A program playing a significant role in bolstering oyster populations and enhancing bay health is the Certificate of Location (CoL) program. Recent amendments to the program by the Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission (TPWC) and rule implementation by Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) promise to further benefit Texas waters.

What is the Certificate of Location Program?

The CoL program, dually managed by TPWD and the Texas General Land Office (GLO), leases areas in Texas coastal waters for private on-bottom oyster harvesting. Previously, this program focused solely on commercial harvest and was strictly limited to approximately 43 areas under location (2,318 acres total) in Galveston Bay. However, with advances in the 88th legislative session (Senate Bill 1032) and recent rule revisions approved by the TPWC, the CoL program can now be expanded for commercial interests and leveraged for much-needed oyster reef restoration projects.

What Makes The CoL Program So Important?

These changes are a turning point for the management of oyster resources in Texas. The CoL program will now have the opportunity to create a more vast economic and environmental impact.

Now, organizations such as non-profits, research institutions, and NGOs can lease degraded areas (up to 100 acres/site) to carry out oyster restoration activities, following active use criteria set by TPWD. During the lease term, these areas will be closed to commercial oyster harvesting. Commercial CoLs follow similar criteria as restoration CoLs but grant the leaseholder exclusive rights to harvest oysters within their leased area. This change creates a dual benefit: dedicated restoration efforts and more sustainable commercial practices.

Setting a New Standard for Oyster Management

Within the oyster community, there is a deep understanding that CoLs are managed meticulously to promote sustainable harvesting. This includes the strategic placement of cultch to provide vertical relief on the reef, which supports the recruitment of oyster larvae for future harvests. This deliberate approach contrasts sharply with the sometimes-chaotic conditions on public oyster reefs.

Combined with the successful and robust oyster

license buyback program, which was strongly supported by CCA Texas with a \$1M donation, the expansion of CoLs will reduce the oyster fishery's dependence on public reefs. This approach protects oyster reef complexes, emphasizing their ecological and structural importance in coastal ecosystems. Additionally, the expansion of CoLs is a necessity for oyster reef conservation, offering a viable offramp for commercial oyster fishermen reliant on

the public reef oyster fishery. It's a winwin for Texas marine resources, anglers, and coastal communities.

The more oyster restoration efforts can be supported, the better. With 15-year lease terms and the right to renew, CoLs enhance opportunities and encourage investment in restoration, ultimately benefiting coastal fisheries and angling opportunities.

According to Rocky Chase, Chairman of the CCA Texas Government Affairs

Committee, the push for restoration Certificates of Location has been a long-standing effort, achieved with the support of State Senator Lois Kolkhorst and State Representative Todd Hunter.



Future investments in CoLs for oyster restoration and commercial interests will leverage the immense benefits oysters provide to water quality, biodiversity, shoreline protection, and carbon sequestration. Collaboration with stakeholders is crucial to ensure the long-term success of restoration efforts.

CCA Texas has pledged \$5 million specifically for oyster reef restoration and intends to utilize a significant portion of these funds under the CoLs umbrella when possible. To start, CCA Texas is working with partners such as the Matagorda Bay Foundation and Gulf Trust to identify potential locations and begin the permit application process.

The ability to now have restoration CoLs is a victory for conservation, anglers, and the future of Texas bays. Thanks in part to TPWD and GLO staff for their thoughtfulness in developing these regulations, CCA Texas is excited to witness the restoration of favorite historic reefs through the CoL program. Implementation of the CoL program puts Texas one step further in ensuring coastal ecosystems remain robust for generations to come.

CCA Texas Funds Over \$1.2 Million for Conservation Efforts

he CCA Texas Executive Board approved just over \$1.2 million for habitat projects, research and Texas Parks and Wildlife (TPWD) Game Warden support at its recent August 2025 meeting. These projects included

\$525,000 for Serpulid reef restoration and research efforts, \$625,000 for continued support of The Harte Research Institute's (HRI) Center for Sportfish Science and Conservation (CSSC), and \$66,660 for Region IV Game Wardens enforcement equipment.

Below is a detailed breakdown of this funding.

Harte Research Institute (HRI) Serpulid Reef Restoration and Research Project - \$525,000

The Coastal Conservation and Restoration group, led by Dr. Jennifer Beseres Pollack at HRI, has studied the bay bottom habitats of Baffin Bay for over a decade. In 2019, CCA Texas funded \$75,000 to study and evaluate the efficacy of using alternative substrates for the restoration of Serpulid reef habitats in Baffin Bay. This initial funding has helped lay the groundwork for the beginning of restoration efforts for Serpulid reefs.

Baffin Bay, Texas, is home to unique Serpulid reefs built by Hydroides dianthus, a species of tube worm capable of thriving in the bay's hypersaline waters. These reefs play a critical role in supporting Baffin Bay's ecosystem, serving as habitat for diverse benthic macrofauna and providing forage for economically and recreationally important fish species like Spotted Seatrout (Cynoscion nebulosus) and Black Drum (Pogonias cromis). However, Serpulid reefs have experienced significant declines in size and distribution due to wave action, propeller damage, and trampling by anglers. Restoration efforts are urgently needed to preserve and rebuild this ecologically important habitat.

From their most recent research, which involved evaluating both recruitment tiles and bull rock for restoration purposes, they have identified the importance of internal spaces, and particularly, downward-facing

surfaces, in facilitating recruitment of Serpulid worms. In comparison, barnacle cover dominated the upward-facing surface of restoration materials. Additionally, they have found that although recruitment of Serpulid worms occurs year-round, the greatest recruitment occurs between September and December. Taken together, these results indicate that there is sufficient larval supply of Serpulid worms for restoration to be successful by providing additional hard substrate with appropriate microhabitat complexity.

The CCA Texas Executive Board approved \$525,000 for the next phase in the restoration of Serpulid reefs. This

funding will cover permitting, construction and monitoring to build a large-scale research and restoration effort. This project will place 155 "Crabitats", 3D printed concrete modules, in Baffin Bay. These structures will provide the preferred areas of growth for the Serpulid worms. CCA Texas looks forward to this next step of research and restoration that deepens the understanding of these unique and ancient structures of nature that are only found along the United States Gulf Coast in Baffin Bay.

Serpulid reefs have experienced significant declines in size and distribution due to wave action, propeller damage, and trampling by anglers. Restoration efforts are urgently needed to preserve and rebuild this ecologically important habitat.

CCA Texas Continues Support of the Center for Sportfish Science and Conservation at the Harte Research Institute (HRI) - \$625,000

CCA Texas has supported the efforts of HRI since its initial \$500,000 funding to establish the Center for Sportfish Science and Conservation (CSSC) in 2012. In 2014, CCA Texas renewed its support with a \$250,000 grant and furthered its commitment to CSSC with a \$625,000 grant at the August

2025 Executive Board meeting. This grant will be funded at \$125,000 per year for five years. CCA Texas members and leadership are proud to support these efforts that provide critical and important science that can be applied to immediate management needs for species that are being studied. Sound science is the bedrock of sound fisheries management, and CCA Texas remains committed to efforts of HRI and the CSSC.

Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) Region IV Game Wardens Awarded Critical Dollars to Ensure Protection of Texas's Coastal Resources - \$66,660

Through the vetting and approval of the CCA Texas TPWD Committee and approval of the Executive Board, CCA Texas has funded \$66,660 for Region IV Wardens. This funding will be for new power and engine conversions for five enforcement vessels in Region IV. These areas include Jefferson, Orange, Harris, Chambers, Galveston, Brazoria and Matagorda counties. TPWD Game Wardens are the front line of the protection of Texas's coastal resources, and CCA Texas is proud to continue their support of them.

UNDERSTANDING VIBRIO INFECTIONS TO STAY SAFE IN MARINE WATERS

What Is Vibrio?

Vibrio is a group of bacteria naturally found in the bays and coastal waters of Texas. If you've been in saltwater, you've encountered Vibrio. Vibrio encompasses a number of different species, but when most people hear "Vibrio", they think about the rare, but traumatic flesh and limb destruction that it can cause, informally referring to it as "flesh eating bacteria."



How can you be exposed?

Infection occurs when Vibrio enters the body through open wounds, even minor cuts or insect bites. Common activities like swimming, fishing, or handling raw seafood can lead to exposure. Risk of infection is most pronounced when water temperature is at or above about 70°F, although infection can occur year-round. A recent study by researchers at the Harte Research Institute for Gulf of Mexico Studies also found that Vibrio populations temporarily increase sharply during Saharan Dust deposition events.

Symptoms of a Vibrio infection

Symptoms of a Vibrio infection can develop rapidly, including pain, swelling, redness, and fever. In severe cases, loss of limbs or death can occur within 24-48 hours if left untreated.



What to do if you are infected?

If you suspect a Vibrio infection (pain, swelling, fever), seek immediate medical attention. Inform healthcare providers about recent saltwater exposure and potential Vibrio infection.





Avoid Saltwater with Open Wounds: Refrain from swimming or wading if you have cuts or abrasions.



Use Protective Gear: Wear puncture-resistant gloves when handling seafood and closed-toed shoes in water.



Wound Care: Immediately treat any wound that has been exposed to saltwater by flushing and cleaning with warm water and antibacterial cleanser; Chlorhexidine -based products such as Hibiclens® can be purchased at your local pharmacy and provide lasting antibacterial effect. Apply a topical antibacterial ointment and cover the wound with a clean dressing or Band -Aid. Fishermen, bathers, and others should carry, or have immediate access to, small bottles of Hibiclens and antibiotic ointment.



Reports from Texas Parks & Wildlife Game Wardens

On 8/09/25, a Brazoria Warden inspected two individuals spearfishing the Surfside jetties. The individuals were found to have speared snook illegally and had no fishing license. Citations issued and cases pending.

On 08/10/2025, a Galveston Warden inspected six individuals and found them to be in possession of six Amberjack during closed federal season and six red snapper exceeding the daily bag limit. Other violations included unregistered vessel and no fishing license. Cases pending.

During July, Wardens continue to patrol the Gulf of America for Shrimp Fisheries Enforcement. Jefferson County Wardens inspected several offshore shrimp boats on 07/24/25 and cited boats for turtle excluder device violations and possession of red snapper. Cases pending.

On 7/19/25, Brazoria County Wardens staked out at a vehicle and boat trailer overnight. When the boat finally made its way back in, Wardens found the individuals to be in possession of a gill net and numerous fish. Five individuals were cited for Illegal means and methods, undersized speckled trout, undersized black drum, no boat registration, no lifejackets, and no navigation lights. Cases pending.

On July 12, Harris County Wardens conducted inspections of bay shrimpers in Galveston Bay. Two boats were found with Turtle Excluder Device (TED) violations. One violation was improper bar spacing for the TED. The other violation involved improper placement of floats that would inhibit the escape of a trapped sea turtle. Cases pending.





A big trout smashes your

topwater—
Oh my gosh, we finally made it to October. Fishing is phenomenal, the most exciting time of year in our Galveston Bay system. There are lots of fish on the reefs, but you'll catch big fish on the shorelines and even bigger fish on the jetties. Fish are all over; Trinity Wells, the gas wells at Bolivar, the jetties, but above all, fishing the birds is my favorite way to locate the fish. Keep an eye on the horizon for those clouds of hungry gulls and remember to ease up to the action very quietly.

Your whole crew should have a great time. Live shrimp are a guaranteed offering, however, shrimp imitation lures and top waters are two of my favorites when working the birds. Might take a lot of casts versus live bait, but If you haven't experienced the special rush when a big trout smashes your topwater,

now's the time.

Wadefishermen this time of year will be catching a lot of trout with live bait in less than two feet of water, but you'll get a much better-quality fish with that old gold spoon or topwater plug, and you won't injure as many small fish. Whether you're fishing deep or on a shoreline or under a mob of birds, the quality of the catch goes up when using artificial lures. Watch for slicks and oily-looking areas on the water.

As always, look after your crew, help anyone who might need it and take a kid fishing—but always wearing a life vest. Remember the limits, return the big ladies and small fish, and have a wonderful fall.—Capt. Ralph Frazier 281-337-0321 fraziersguideservice.

Fall Fishing:
Abundance Defined
When someone asks me, "What's your favorite time of year to fish?" my answer has never wavered:
October and November. There's abundance in everything this season — schools of bait, number of anglers, and, most importantly, the sheer variety of fish. Speckled trout, redfish, black drum, flounder, sheepshead — if it swims, chances are it's biting right now.

Yes, Fall is a busy time for most, but the best days are right around the corner. With a little help from Mother Nature, the water is cooling, tides are rising, and the October moon is about to work its magic. More water means more oxygen, which means fish come alive — and so do the anglers. Shorter days give fish more recovery time under cover of night, setting the stage for spectacular daytime action.

But here's the catch — you have to be here to enjoy it. Make it a plan, not a wish. Dust off that boat or call your favorite Captain and carve out time for yourself and your family to enjoy this angling paradise.

Walk a reef, stalk a lonely shoreline, and feel the thump of a hookset under crisp autumn skies.

Lower humidity and happy fish

It's finally that time of year again. Fall is in the air! Cooler temperatures, lower humidity and happy fish! Summertime low tides will be behind us allowing higher tides to reach some backwater bays.

Look for fish to be moving into these areas in search of fresh food. Small shrimp and crab patterns in natural colors should work well for the fly fishermen who are poling these flats. Drifting and wading will also be productive. The trout bite has been really good all summer and will continue through the fall. TPW's regulations have really helped the Lower Laguna Madre. We have seen a good number of large fish and plenty of juveniles.

Look for areas that have turtle grass mixed with potholes in 2-3 foot of water. Cooler water temperatures will have the fish laid up on darker bottoms that hold the warmth. Work a 3-4" plastic lure through these flats in a white/chartreuse color.

Of course the top water bite will be great too! I like to use a larger top water bait in a bone color during this time of the year. So don't winterize that boat just yet. Best time of the year to be on the water is upon us! Grab the kiddos and some tackle and get out there. Adios! —Capt. Bryan Robinson 956-241-5520

Paula's Classic Fish Saute

4 fresh trout fillets / Seasoning of choice / 1 sleeve Ritz type crackers, crushed / 1 cup garlic croutons, crushed / 2 eggs well beaten 3 Tbsp olive oil / 2 Tbsp butter

Pat fillets dry and season well on both sides. Completely cover each with the beaten eggs, then dredge in the cracker/crouton mixture. Saute in the butter/olive oil in a large skillet over medium. High heat, turning once when browned. 2 minutes on each side.

Fillet should flake easily. Enjoy!






